1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Coast Smart Council – Duties and Authority**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the duties of the Coast Smart Council to include the
4 development of eligibility criteria, standards, and procedures for categorical
5 exemptions from the application of certain Coast Smart requirements for certain
6 projects under certain circumstances; authorizing the Council to recommend certain
7 regulations for adoption by the Secretary of Natural Resources; and generally
8 relating to the Coast Smart Council.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
20 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

4 (b) (1) “Coast Smart” means a construction practice in which preliminary
5 planning, siting, design, construction, operation, maintenance, and repair of a structure or
6 highway facility avoids or minimizes future impacts associated with coastal flooding and
7 sea level rise inundation.8 (2) “Coast Smart” includes design criteria and siting criteria that are
9 applicable throughout the entire life cycle of a project.

10 (c) “Council” means the Coast Smart Council.

11 3–1006.

12 (a) The Council shall:

13 (1) Study and provide analysis regarding standards and factors relevant to
14 the establishment of Coast Smart siting criteria and design criteria;15 (2) Develop siting and design criteria to establish and implement Coast
16 Smart practices and requirements;17 (3) Develop eligibility criteria, standards, and procedures for applying for
18 and obtaining a waiver from compliance with the Coast Smart requirements; [and]19 (4) Establish procedures for evaluating Coast Smart waiver applications
20 that include the consideration of proposed capital projects with regard to:21 (i) The anticipated need to prepare for, respond to, and recover from
22 extreme weather events, sea level rise inundation, coastal flooding, storm surges, and
23 shoreline erosion; and24 (ii) The need to prevent danger to life and property and to avoid
25 environmental, socio-economic, and economic harm; AND26 **(5) DEVELOP ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA, STANDARDS, AND PROCEDURES**
27 **FOR CATEGORICAL EXEMPTIONS FROM THE APPLICATION OF THE COAST SMART**
28 **REQUIREMENTS FOR PROPOSED CAPITAL PROJECTS THAT HAVE BEEN DESIGNED TO**
29 **INCLUDE ADAPTATION AND RESILIENCY FEATURES TO PREVENT OR MITIGATE**
30 **DAMAGE TO THE MAXIMUM EXTENT PRACTICABLE.**

1 (b) **THE COUNCIL MAY RECOMMEND REGULATIONS FOR ADOPTION BY THE**
2 **SECRETARY TO CARRY OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBTITLE.**

3 (c) The chair of the Council may establish subcommittees consisting of members
4 of the Council, experts in fields related to climate change and sea level rise, and interested
5 parties to address or study specific issues.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
7 October 1, 2024.
