A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 16 of Title 15 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to general provisions regarding sheriffs, so as to provide for a minimum annual
- 3 salary for each deputy appointed by sheriffs; to establish within the Department of
- 4 Community Affairs the Deputy Sheriffs Compensation Grant Program; to provide for rules
- 5 and regulations; to amend Chapter 13 of Title 48 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 6 relating to specific, business, and occupation taxes, so as to provide for an excise tax on the
- 7 sale of contact lenses and spectacles for which a prescription is required by law; to dedicate
- 8 moneys collected from the excise tax on the sale of contact lenses and spectacles for which
- 9 a prescription is required by law; to provide for penalties; to provide for definitions; to
- 10 provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date contingent on a certain
- 11 ratification of the Constitution of Georgia; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 14 Article 1 of Chapter 16 of Title 15 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 15 general provisions regarding sheriffs, is amended by revising Code Section 15-16-23,
- 16 relating to the appointment of deputy sheriffs and bond, as follows:
- 17 "15-16-23.
- 18 (a) Sheriffs are authorized in their discretion to appoint one or more deputies. Each deputy
- shall be required to execute a bond with a surety in the amount of \$5,000.00 payable to the
- sheriff and conditioned upon the faithful accounting for all public and other funds or
- 21 property coming into the such deputy's custody, control, care, or possession.
- 22 (b) On and after July 1, 2020, each deputy appointed by a sheriff shall be compensated at
- 23 <u>a rate of pay equal to an annual salary of \$33,500.00."</u>

24 SECTION 2.

25 Said article is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

- 26 "15-16-23.1.
- 27 (a) There is established within the Department of Community Affairs the Deputy Sheriffs
- 28 <u>Compensation Grant Program. The payment of grants under this Code section shall be</u>
- 29 <u>contingent upon the payment of funds into the grant program through the excise tax</u>
- 30 provided for in Article 8 of Chapter 13 of Title 48.
- 31 (b) The Department of Community Affairs shall promulgate rules and regulations which
- 32 <u>shall provide for:</u>
- 33 (1) Standards and procedures for sheriffs to make application for grant funds to be used
- in meeting the requirements for the compensation of deputy sheriffs pursuant to
- 35 <u>subsection (b) of Code Section 15-16-23;</u>
- 36 (2) Standards and procedures for sheriffs to establish a financial need and demonstrate
- 37 <u>that without such grant funds such sheriff would not be able to meet the requirements for</u>
- 38 the compensation of deputy sheriffs pursuant to subsection (b) of Code Section 15-16-23;
- 39 <u>and</u>
- 40 (3) Standards and procedures to ensure that sheriffs shall use such funds for the wages
- 41 <u>and compensation of deputy sheriffs.</u>
- 42 (c)(1) Funds paid out to sheriffs under this Code section shall be paid to the governing
- 43 <u>authority of the county of such sheriff who shall appropriate such funds to such sheriff.</u>
- 44 (2) Funds paid out under this Code section shall not be used to supplant county funds
- 45 appropriated to the sheriff but shall be used to increase the amount of funds that would,
- in the absence of such funds, be paid out under this Code section.
- 47 (3)(A) The Department of Community Affairs shall audit and verify that funds paid out
- 48 <u>under this Code section are used in conformity with the provisions of this Code section.</u>
- 49 (B) The commissioner of community affairs shall revoke the qualified local
- 50 government status of any county that misuses or misappropriates funds awarded under
- 51 <u>this Code section. The commissioner of community affairs shall reinstate such status</u>
- only after corrective actions that restore such grant funds to the appropriate party as
- 53 provided for under this Code section are made, or restitution of such funds is made to
- 54 <u>the grant program by such county.</u>
- (C) The commissioner of community affairs shall publish an annual list of any sheriffs
- 56 <u>that misuse or misappropriate funds awarded under this Code section. Any such sheriff</u>
- 57 <u>shall be ineligible to make application for grant funds under this Code section if he or</u>
- she, after being notified of misuse or misappropriation of funds, continues to misuse or
- 59 <u>misappropriate funds."</u>

61 Chapter 13 of Title 48 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to specific,

business, and occupation taxes, is amended by adding a new article to read as follows:

63 "ARTICLE 8.

- 64 <u>48-13-140.</u>
- As used in this article, the term:
- 66 (1) 'Contact lens' shall have the same meaning as provided for in Code Section 31-12-12.
- 67 (2) 'Prescription' shall have the same meaning as provided for in Code Section 31-12-12.
- 68 (3) 'Seller' means the person who sells or serves as a conduit for the sale of contact lenses
- or spectacles for which a prescription is required by law for such sale in this state.
- 70 (4) 'Spectacles' shall have the same meaning as provided for in Code Section 31-12-12.
- 71 <u>48-13-141.</u>
- 72 (a) An excise tax, in addition to all other taxes of any kind imposed by law, is imposed
- 73 upon the sale of contact lenses and spectacles for which a prescription is required by law
- for such sale in this state at a rate of 1 percent per item sold.
- 75 (b) Moneys collected from the excise tax on the sale of contact lenses or spectacles for
- which a prescription is required by law for such sale in this state as provided for under
- 37 subsection (a) of this Code section, and pursuant to Article III, Section IX, Paragraph VI
- of the Constitution of Georgia, shall be paid into the Deputy Sheriffs Compensation Grant
- 79 <u>Program and used as provided for in Code Section 15-16-23.1.</u>
- 80 48-13-142.
- A seller who knowingly and willfully violates the requirements of this article shall be
- 82 <u>assessed a civil penalty of not more than \$10,000.00 in addition to the amount of tax due.</u>
- 83 <u>48-13-143.</u>
- 84 The department is authorized to adopt rules and regulations necessary for the enforcement
- 85 and implementation of the provisions of this Code section."
- SECTION 4.
- 87 This Act shall become effective on January 1, 2019, only if there is ratified at the 2018
- 88 general election an amendment to the Constitution of Georgia which authorizes the General
- 89 Assembly to provide for the use, dedication, and deposit of revenues raised by an excise tax

90 on the sale of contact lenses and spectacles for which a prescription is required by law for

91 purposes of deputy sheriff compensation in this state.
