A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 47-23-64 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 transfer of funds from the Employees' Retirement System of Georgia to the Georgia Judicial
- 3 Retirement System by judges, solicitors-general, or district attorneys and crediting service,
- 4 so as to provide that any member of such retirement system shall be eligible to transfer funds;
- 5 to provide conditions for an effective date and automatic repeal; to repeal conflicting laws;
- 6 and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Code Section 47-23-64 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to transfer of
- 10 funds from the Employees' Retirement System of Georgia to the Georgia Judicial Retirement
- 11 System by judges, solicitors-general, or district attorneys and crediting service, is amended
- 12 by revising paragraph (1) of subsection (a) as follows:
- 13 "(a)(1) Any superior court judge, state court judge, solicitor general, or district attorney
- 14 <u>member of this retirement system</u> who was previously an active member of the
- Employees' Retirement System of Georgia may elect to have all contributions made by
- or on behalf of such member transferred from such retirement system to this retirement
- system. Any such member shall notify the board of trustees of each retirement system

not later than December 31, 2002 2018, or within 90 days after first becoming a member

of this retirement system, whichever date is later."

SECTION 2.

- 21 This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2018, only if it is determined to have been
- 22 concurrently funded as provided in Chapter 20 of Title 47 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 23 Annotated, the "Public Retirement Systems Standards Law"; otherwise, this Act shall not
- 24 become effective and shall be automatically repealed in its entirety on July 1, 2018, as
- 25 required by subsection (a) of Code Section 47-20-50.
