## A BILL ENTITLED

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1	AN	ACT	concerning

2	Department of General Services – Energy-Conserving Standards
3	(Maryland Sustainable Buildings Act of 2020)

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of General Services to establish and 5 periodically update certain standards for State buildings to conserve energy and 6 minimize adverse impacts on birds; requiring each State building constructed, 7 acquired, or substantially altered by the State to meet the standards to the extent 8 practicable and within budgetary constraints; requiring the Department to reduce 9 the lighting of existing State buildings in a certain manner; requiring the Secretary of General Services to adopt certain regulations; establishing that certain 10 11 requirements do not apply to certain contracts or projects; defining "State building"; 12 and generally relating to the construction, alteration, or acquisition of State buildings. 13

WHEREAS, The amount of glass used in new building construction is increasing dramatically in Maryland and worldwide; and

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

- WHEREAS, The increase in the use of glass in buildings threatens to undo energy conservation efforts, cost the State money, and contribute to climate change and biodiversity loss; and
- WHEREAS, Adopting building standards to protect birds will reduce energy consumption by approximately 40% or more, making State buildings more sustainable and saving taxpayers money; now, therefore,
- 7 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 8 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 9 Article – State Finance and Procurement

- 11 (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 12 (b) "Department" means the Department of General Services.
- 13 (c) "Secretary" means the Secretary of General Services.
- 14 **4–410.1.**
- 15 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "STATE BUILDING" MEANS:
- 16 (1) A BUILDING ACQUIRED THROUGH ANY MEANS BY THE STATE FOR USE BY A STATE AGENCY OR DEPARTMENT;
- 18 (2) A BUILDING CONSTRUCTED OR RENOVATED BY OR FOR THE STATE 19 FOR OCCUPANCY BY A STATE AGENCY OR DEPARTMENT; OR
- 20 (3) A BUILDING ACQUIRED, CONSTRUCTED, OR RENOVATED FOR 21 WHICH MORE THAN 50% OF THE MONEY FOR THE ACQUISITION, CONSTRUCTION, OR
- 22 RENOVATION CAME FROM STATE FUNDS.
- 23 (B) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO:
- 24 (1) A PUBLIC WORK CONTRACT OF LESS THAN \$500,000;
- 25 (2) A PUBLIC WORK CONTRACT FOR WHICH 50% OR LESS OF THE 26 FUNDS USED FOR THE PROJECT ARE STATE FUNDS; OR
- 27 (3) A PROJECT FOR WHICH FUNDING IS PROVIDED IN THE CAPITAL BUDGET AS A GRANT TO A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION.
- 29 (C) (1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH STANDARDS FOR STATE

- 1 BUILDINGS TO CONSERVE ENERGY AND MINIMIZE ADVERSE IMPACTS ON BIRDS
- 2 THAT ARE CONSISTENT WITH GREEN BUILDING COUNCIL LEED PILOT CREDIT 55
- 3 FOR REDUCING BIRD COLLISIONS AND THE AMERICAN BIRD CONSERVANCY
- 4 BIRD-FRIENDLY DESIGN RECOMMENDATIONS.
- 5 (2) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL UPDATE THE STANDARDS DEVELOPED
- 6 UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION EVERY 5 YEARS.
- 7 (3) THE STANDARDS DEVELOPED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL
- 8 SPECIFY THAT, EXCEPT WHERE FULL OPERATION OF BUILDING LIGHTING IS
- 9 DOCUMENTED AS NECESSARY, INCLUDING FOR PUBLIC SAFETY OR OTHER
- 10 PURPOSES, INTERIOR AND EXTERIOR LIGHTING SHALL BE APPROPRIATELY
- 11 SHIELDED AND MINIMIZED FROM MIDNIGHT TO DAWN EACH DAY:
- 12 (I) FROM MARCH 1 THROUGH MAY 31, BOTH INCLUSIVE; AND
- 13 (II) FROM AUGUST 1 THROUGH OCTOBER 31, BOTH INCLUSIVE.
- 14 (D) EACH STATE BUILDING CONSTRUCTED, SUBSTANTIALLY ALTERED, OR
- 15 ACQUIRED BY THE STATE SHALL MEET, TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE AND WITHIN
- 16 BUDGETARY CONSTRAINTS AS DETERMINED BY THE DEPARTMENT, THE STANDARDS
- 17 ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION.
- 18 (E) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REDUCE THE LIGHTING OF EXISTING STATE
- 19 BUILDINGS, TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE AND WITHIN BUDGETARY CONSTRAINTS
- 20 AS DETERMINED BY THE DEPARTMENT:
- 21 (1) IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (C)(3) OF THIS SECTION; AND
- 22 (2) BY USING AUTOMATIC CONTROL TECHNOLOGIES, INCLUDING
- 23 TIMERS, PHOTOSENSORS, INFRARED DETECTORS, AND MOTION DETECTORS.
- 24 (F) THE SECRETARY SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THE
- 25 PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 27 October 1, 2020.
