| 9 | <u>(2)</u> | A city, urban-county government, charter county government, consolidated local |
| 10 | | government, or unified local government shall not enact or enforce any |
| 11 | | ordinance, zoning regulation, or policy that directly or indirectly prohibits a |
| 12 | | person from keeping six (6) or fewer backyard chickens on any residential |
| 13 | | property. |
| 14 | <u>(3)</u> | A city, urban-county government, charter county government, consolidated local |
| 15 | | government, and unified local government may enact and enforce reasonable |
| 16 | | ordinances regulations, or policies to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of |

| 18 | | (a) Setback requirements for coops holding backyard chickens from property |
