- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

15 (a) (1) [Any] A person who fails to pay or deliver abandoned property to the 16 Administrator as required by this title shall pay a penalty equal to [15 percent] 15% of the 17 value of the property.

18 (2) If [any] A person fails to file any report or refuses to deliver property to 19 the Administrator as required by this title, the Administrator may bring an action in a 20 court of appropriate jurisdiction to require the filing of the report and to enforce delivery of 21 the property.

(b) [Any] A person who willfully fails to render any report or perform any other duty required by this subtitle is subject to a fine of \$100 for each day the report is withheld,
