# S. 3433

To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to make certain improvements in the Office for Civil Rights and Civil Liberties of the Department of Homeland Security, and for other purposes.

### IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

Mr. Peters (for himself and Ms. Hassan) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs

## A BILL

- To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to make certain improvements in the Office for Civil Rights and Civil Liberties of the Department of Homeland Security, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
  - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
  - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Department of Home-
  - 5 land Security Office for Civil Rights and Civil Liberties
  - 6 Authorization Act".

1	SEC. 2. OFFICER FOR CIVIL RIGHTS AND CIVIL LIBERTIES
2	(a) In General.—Section 705 of the Homeland Se-
3	curity Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 345) is amended—
4	(1) in the section heading, by striking "ESTAB-
5	LISHMENT OF"; and
6	(2) by striking subsections (a) and (b) and in-
7	serting the following new subsections:
8	"(a) In General.—There is established within the
9	Department an Office for Civil Rights and Civil Liberties.
10	The head of such Office is the Officer for Civil Rights
11	and Civil Liberties (referred to in this section as the 'Offi-
12	cer'), who shall report directly to the Secretary.
13	"(b) Responsibilities.—The Officer shall carry out
14	the following responsibilities:
15	"(1) Oversee compliance with constitutional
16	statutory, regulatory, policy, and other requirements
17	relating to the civil rights and civil liberties of indi-
18	viduals affected by the programs and activities of
19	the Department.
20	"(2) Integrate civil rights and civil liberties pro-
21	tections into all programs and activities of the De-
22	partment.
23	"(3) Conduct civil rights and civil liberties im-
24	pact assessments, including, as appropriate, prior to
25	the implementation of new Department regulations,
26	initiatives, programs, or policies.

- "(4) Conduct periodic reviews and assessments of policies, procedures, and activities of the Department relating to civil rights and civil liberties, induding reviews initiated by the Officer.
  - "(5) Provide policy advice, recommendations, and other technical assistance relating to civil rights and civil liberties to the Secretary and to heads of components, directorates, and offices and other personnel within the Department.
  - "(6) Review, assess, and investigate complaints, including complaints filed by members of the public, and information indicating possible abuses of civil rights or civil liberties at the Department, unless the Inspector General of the Department determines that any such complaint should be investigated by the Inspector General.
  - "(7) As the Officer determines necessary, initiate reviews, investigations, and assessments of the administration of the programs and activities by the Department relating to civil rights and civil liberties.
  - "(8) Coordinate with the Privacy Officer to ensure that—
- 23 "(A) programs, policies, and procedures in-24 volving civil rights, civil liberties, and privacy

1	considerations are addressed in an integrated
2	and comprehensive manner; and
3	"(B) Congress receives appropriate reports
4	regarding such programs, policies, and proce-
5	dures.
6	"(9) Lead the equal employment opportunity
7	programs of the Department, including complaint
8	management and adjudication, workforce diversity,
9	and promotion of the merit system principles.
10	"(10) On a semi-annual basis, make publicly
11	available through accessible communications chan-
12	nels, including the website of the Department—
13	"(A) information on the responsibilities
14	and functions of, and how to contact, the Of-
15	fice;
16	"(B) summary of the investigations that
17	result in final recommendations that are issued
18	by the Officer carried out pursuant to para-
19	graph (6); and
20	"(C) summaries of impact assessments
21	issued by the Officer and carried out pursuant
22	to paragraph (3) or (7).
23	"(11) Engage with individuals and communities
24	whose civil rights and civil liberties may be affected
25	by programs and activities of the Department, in-

cluding by informing such individuals and communities about report and redress processes and advising the Secretary and heads of components, directorates, offices, and other personnel within the Department of concerns raised by such individuals and communities.

### "(c) Transparency.—

"(1) COMPLAINTS.—In the case of a complaint made concerning allegations of abuses of civil rights and civil liberties under paragraph (6) of subsection (b), the Officer shall—

"(A) provide to the individual who made the complaint notice of the receipt of such complaint within 30 days of receiving the complaint; and

"(B) inform the complainant of the determination of the Officer regarding the initiation of a review, assessment, or investigation within the Office, a referral to the Inspector General of the Department, or any other action taken.

"(2) INVESTIGATIONS.—In the case of an investigation initiated by the Officer pursuant to paragraph (6) or (7) of subsection (b) in which findings or recommendations are issued, the Officer shall, on a semi-annual basis, make publicly available through

1	accessible communications channels, including the
2	website of the Department—
3	"(A) the findings and recommendations of
4	the Officer, if any;
5	"(B) a summary of the investigations that
6	result in final recommendations that are issued
7	by the Officer; and
8	"(C) shall not include any personally iden-
9	tifiable information related to any individual in-
10	volved in such investigation.
11	"(3) Submittal to heads of operational
12	COMPONENTS.—The Officer shall transmit a copy of
13	each summary produced under paragraph (2) to the
14	Secretary and to the relevant head of each relevant
15	operational component of the Department.
16	"(4) Reports to congress.—Upon the con-
17	clusion of any investigation conducted by the Officer
18	under paragraph (6) or (7) of subsection (b) in
19	which findings or recommendations are issued, the
20	Officer shall submit to Congress a report on the in-
21	vestigation, which shall be prepared and submitted
22	without any prior comment or amendment by the
23	Secretary, Deputy Secretary, or any other officer or

employee of the Department or the Office of Man-

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1	agement and Budget, unless the Officer seeks such
2	comment.
3	"(d) Component Civil Rights and Civil Lib-
4	ERTIES OFFICER.—The head of each of the operational
5	components of the Department, in consultation with the
6	Officer, shall designate a career appointee (as such term
7	is defined in section 3132 of title 5, United States Code)
8	from such component as the Officer for Civil Rights and
9	Civil Liberties of that component. The Officer for Civil
10	Rights and Civil Liberties of each such component shall
11	coordinate with and provide information to the Officer for
12	Civil Rights and Civil Liberties of the Department on mat-
13	ters related to civil rights and civil liberties within the
14	components.
15	"(e) Access to Information.—The Officer—
16	"(1) shall have access in a timely manner to all
17	records, reports, audits, reviews, documents, papers
18	recommendations, and other materials available to
19	the Department that relate to programs and oper-
20	ations with respect to the responsibilities of the Offi-
21	cer under subsection (b); and
22	"(2) may, to the extent the Officer determines
23	necessary, and subject to the approval of the Sec-
24	retary—

1	"(A) issue a subpoena to require the pro-
2	duction, by any person other than a Federal
3	agency, of all information, documents, reports
4	answers, records, accounts, papers, and other
5	documentary evidence necessary in the perform-
6	ance of the responsibilities of the Officer under
7	this section; and
8	"(B) administer to or take from any per-
9	son an oath, affirmation, or affidavit, whenever
10	necessary in the performance of the responsibil-
11	ities of the Officer under this section.
12	"(f) Annual Report.—Not later than March 31 of
13	each year, the Officer shall submit to the appropriate com-
14	mittees and subcommittees of Congress a report on the
15	implementation of this section during the year preceding
16	the year during which the report is submitted. Each such
17	report shall include, for the year covered by the report—
18	"(1) a list of Department programs and activi-
19	ties for which civil rights and civil liberties impact
20	assessments were conducted, or policy advice, rec-
21	ommendations, or other technical assistance was
22	provided;
23	"(2) a summary of investigations resulting in
24	recommendations issued under paragraph (6) or (7)

of subsection (b) by the Officer to the Secretary or

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1	the head of a component, directorate, or office, to-
2	gether with information on the status of the compo-
3	nent, directorate, or office's implementation of such
4	recommendations;
5	"(3) information on the diversity and equal em-
6	ployment opportunity activities of the Department
7	including information on complaint management and
8	adjudication of equal employment opportunity com-
9	plaints and efforts to ensure compliance throughout
10	the Department with equal employment opportunity
11	requirements;
12	"(4) a description of any efforts to engage with
13	individuals and communities whose civil rights and
14	civil liberties may be affected by activities carried
15	out by the Department, including public meetings.
16	and
17	"(5) information on total staffing for the Office
18	for Civil Rights and Civil Liberties, including—
19	"(A) the number of full-time, part-time
20	and contract support personnel; and
21	"(B) information on the number of em-
22	ployees whose primary responsibilities include
23	supporting the Officer in carrying out para-
24	graph (9) of subsection (b).".

- 1 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The item relating to
- 2 section 705 in section 1(b) of the Homeland Security Act
- 3 of 2002 is amended to read as follows:
- 4 "SEC. 705. OFFICER FOR CIVIL RIGHTS AND CIVIL LIB-
- 5 ERTIES.".
- 6 (c) Reporting to Congress.—Section
- 7 1062(f)(1)(A)(i) of the National Security Intelligence Re-
- 8 form Act of 2004 (42 U.S.C. 2000ee–1(f)(1)(A)(i)) is
- 9 amended by inserting "the Committee on Homeland Secu-
- 10 rity of the House of Representatives," after "Affairs of
- 11 the Senate,".
- 12 SEC. 3. COMPTROLLER GENERAL REVIEW.
- Not later than 2 years after the date of the enact-
- 14 ment of this Act, the Comptroller General of the United
- 15 States shall submit to Congress a report on subsection
- 16 (b)(11) of section 705 of the Homeland Security Act of
- 17 2002 (6 U.S.C. 345), as amended by section 2.

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
