To provide that during an emergency declared under the National Emergencies Act or the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, supplemental nutrition assistance program benefits issued under the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008 may be used to purchase certain durable goods.

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Food and Necessities
- 5 During Public Emergencies Act of 2020".

5	During an emergency declared under the National
6	Emergencies Act (50 U.S.C. 1601 et seq.) or the Robert
7	T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act
8	(42 U.S.C. 5121 et seq.), the term "food" as defined in
9	section 3(k)(1) of the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008
10	(7 U.S.C. 2012(k)(1)) shall be deemed to include the fol-
11	lowing:
12	(1) Infant care necessities, including diapers
13	(disposable or re-useable), baby wipes, and bottles.
14	(2) Household paper products, including tis-
15	sues, toilet paper, and paper towels.
16	(3) Household cleaning products, including
17	mops, brooms, bleach (or equivalent cleaning solu-
18	tions), and cleaning wipes.
19	(4) Personal cleaning products, including tooth-
20	brushes, toothpaste, soap, shampoo, hand sanitizer
21	and deodorant
