Mr. Meadows (for himself, Mr. Cummings, and Ms. Delauro) submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing support for designation of October 28 as "Honoring the Nation's First Responders Day".

Whereas first responders include all professional and volunteer fire, police, emergency medical technician (EMT), and paramedic workers in the United States;

Whereas according to a 2017 compilation of data on the Emergency Services Sector in the United States by the Department of Homeland Security, "The first responder community comprises an estimated 4.6 million career and volunteer professionals within five primary disciplines: Law Enforcement, Fire and Rescue Services, Emergency Medical Services, Emergency Management, and Public Works.";

Whereas first responders deserve to be recognized for their commitment to safety, defense, and honor; and

Whereas October 28 would be an appropriate day to establish as "Honoring the Nation's First Responders Day": Now, therefore, be it

- Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate
 concurring), That Congress—
- 3 (1) supports the designation of "Honoring the 4 Nation's First Responders Day";
- 5 (2) honors and recognizes the contributions of 6 first responders; and
- 7 (3) encourages the people of the United States 8 to observe "Honoring the Nation's First Responders 9 Day" with appropriate ceremonies and activities that 10 promote awareness of the contributions of the Na-11 tion's first responders.
