8	SYNOPSIS:	Under existing law, the membership of the
9		State Board of Education includes the Governor as
10		an ex officio member and eight members elected from
11		districts provided by general law, and the State
12		Department of Education, which is under the
13		direction of a board-appointed State Superintendent
14		of Education, with the advice and counsel of the
15		State Board of Education, is responsible for
16		assisting the State Board of Education in executing
17		the policies and procedures authorized by law and
18		by regulations of the State Board of Education.
19		This bill would propose an amendment to the
20		Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to rename the
21		State Board of Education as the Alabama Commission
22		on Elementary and Secondary Education and to
23		provide that the members of the commission are
24		appointed by the Governor, subject to confirmation
25		by the Senate.

This bill would propose to rename the State Superintendent of Education as the Secretary of

Elementary and Secondary Education and to provide for the secretary to be appointed by the commission, subject to confirmation by the Senate.

This bill would also propose to authorize the Governor to appoint a team of local educators and other officials to advise the commission on matters relating to the functioning and duties of the State Department of Education.

To propose an amendment to Amendment 284 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 262 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, relating to the composition of the State Board of Education and the appointment of the State Superintendent of Education; to change the name of the board to the Alabama Commission on Elementary and Secondary Education; to change the name of the superintendent to the Secretary of Elementary and Secondary Education; to require the members of the commission to be appointed by the Governor, subject to confirmation by the Senate; to require the Secretary of Elementary and Secondary Education to be appointed by the commission, subject to confirmation by the Senate; and to authorize the Governor to appoint a team of

local educators and other officials to advise the commission on matters relating to the functioning and duties of the State

3 Department of Education.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon at the statewide primary election held on March 3, 2020, and in accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Amendment 284 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 262 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, is amended to read as follows:

"Amendment 284.

"1. General supervision of the public schools in Alabama and the State Department of Education shall be vested in a state board of education, which the Alabama Commission on Elementary and Secondary Education. One member of the commission shall be elected appointed by the Governor from each state congressional district, as those districts exist on the date of appointment, and any additional members, if necessary, shall be appointed by the Governor from the state at large, so that each congressional district is represented on the commission and the total number of appointed members

equals nine. In the event the number of state congressional districts is greater than nine, the Legislature shall provide an alternative method for the appointment of the nine appointed members. Each member appointed to the commission shall be subject to confirmation by the Senate in such manner as the legislature may provide. The Governor shall ensure that the appointed membership of the commission reflects the geographical, gender, and racial diversity of the students enrolled in public K-12 education in the state. Unless otherwise provided by the Legislature for initially staggered terms and for the filling of an unexpired term created by a vacancy, appointed members of the commission shall serve for terms of six years and may not serve for more than two full consecutive terms on the commission. Upon ratification of this amendment, and the appointment of the members of the Alabama Commission on Elementary and Secondary Education pursuant to this amendment, respectively, the terms of the then serving members of the State Board of Education shall end.

"2. The chief state school officer shall be the state superintendent of education Secretary of Elementary and Secondary Education, who shall be appointed by the state board of education commission, subject to confirmation by the Senate. The secretary shall be a nonvoting member of the commission and shall serve at its pleasure in the position of secretary until a successor is appointed. If the Legislature is not in session when a vacancy in the position of secretary

1 occurs, the commission shall appoint an interim secretary and 2 shall submit the name of an individual for confirmation for 3 the position of secretary during the next regular legislative session. If the Legislature does not confirm the appointee 4 5 within five legislative days, the position of secretary shall be vacant and the commission shall appoint another individual 7 to the position of interim secretary. The authority and duties 8 of the superintendent of education secretary, and the terms 9 and conditions of his or her employment including, but not 10 limited to, tenure in office, shall be determined by the state board of education according to such regulations as the 11 12 legislature may prescribe commission. The superintendent of 13 education secretary shall receive an annual salary which shall 14 be fixed by the legislature of Alabama commission and shall be paid from the state treasury State Treasury in installments as 15 the salaries of other state officers are paid. 16

"3. The legislature <u>Legislature</u> shall enact appropriate laws to implement or enforce this article of amendment.

- "4. The provisions of article Articles V and XIV of the Constitution of Alabama as amended in conflict with this article amendment are expressly repealed. However, this amendment shall not be so construed as to effect the election or term of the state superintendent of education chosen before it becomes valid as a part of the Constitution.
- "5. In addition to any function or duty provided by general law, the commission shall adopt all of the following:

1	"a. Course of study standards that ensure nationwide
2	consistency and the seamless transfer of students from within
3	and outside of the state, in lieu of common core.
4	"b. A comprehensive educator certification program.
5	"c. A comprehensive professional development program
6	for educators.
7	"d. A comprehensive assessment system.
8	"e. A comprehensive accountability system.
9	"6. Immediately after the commission members are
10	appointed and confirmed, the Governor shall appoint a diverse
11	team of current and former educators, school administrators,
12	and appropriate officials from throughout the state, as
13	determined necessary by the Governor, to consult with and make
14	recommendations to the commission on a regular basis relating
15	to the operation and functioning of the State Department of
16	Education.
17	"7. The State Department of Education shall be
18	governed by the commission and shall work in coordination with

20	Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment
21	shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the
22	Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284
23	and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
24	Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this
25	state.
26	Section 3. The appropriate election official shall
27	assign a hallot number for the proposed constitutional

amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 1 2 following description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed constitutional amendment: 3 "Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of 4 5 Alabama of 1901, to change the name of the State Board of Education to the Alabama Commission on Elementary and 6 Secondary Education; to provide for the appointment of the members of the commission by the Governor, subject to confirmation by the Senate; to change the name of the State 9 10 Superintendent of Education to the Secretary of Elementary and Secondary Education; to provide for the appointment of the 11 secretary by the commission, subject to confirmation by the 12 13 Senate; and to authorize the Governor to appoint a team of 14 local educators and other officials to advise the commission 15 on matters relating to the functioning and duties of the State 16 Department of Education. "Proposed by Act ____." 17 18 This description shall be followed by the following 19 language:
