A BILL

1 **SECTION 1. REPEAL OF PPACA AND HEALTH CARE-RE-**
2 **LATED PROVISIONS IN THE HEALTH CARE**
3 **AND EDUCATION RECONCILIATION ACT OF**
4 **2010.**

5 (a) PPACA.—Effective January 1, 2023, the Patient
6 Protection and Affordable Care Act (Public Law 111–
7 148) is repealed, and the provisions of law amended or
8 repealed by such Act are restored or revived as if such
9 Act had not been enacted.

10 (b) HEALTH CARE-RELATED PROVISIONS IN THE
11 HEALTH CARE AND EDUCATION RECONCILIATION ACT OF
12 2010.—Effective January 1, 2023, title I and subtitle B
13 of title II of the Health Care and Education Reconciliation
14 Act of 2010 (Public Law 111–152) are repealed, and the
15 provisions of law amended or repealed by such title or sub-
16 title, respectively, are restored or revived as if such title
17 and subtitle had not been enacted.

18 **SEC. 2. BUDGETARY EFFECTS.**

19 The budgetary effects of this Act shall not be entered
20 on either PAYGO scorecard maintained pursuant to sec-
21 tion 4(d) of the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010.

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
