1SECTION 1. REPEAL OF PPACA AND HEALTH CARE-RE-2LATED PROVISIONS IN THE HEALTH CARE3AND EDUCATION RECONCILIATION ACT OF42010.

5 (a) PPACA.—Effective January 1, 2023, the Patient
6 Protection and Affordable Care Act (Public Law 111–
7 148) is repealed, and the provisions of law amended or
8 repealed by such Act are restored or revived as if such
9 Act had not been enacted.

10 (b) HEALTH CARE-RELATED PROVISIONS IN THE HEALTH CARE AND EDUCATION RECONCILIATION ACT OF 11 2010.—Effective January 1, 2023, title I and subtitle B 12 of title II of the Health Care and Education Reconciliation 13 14 Act of 2010 (Public Law 111–152) are repealed, and the provisions of law amended or repealed by such title or sub-15 16 title, respectively, are restored or revived as if such title and subtitle had not been enacted. 17

## 18 SEC. 2. BUDGETARY EFFECTS.

The budgetary effects of this Act shall not be entered
on either PAYGO scorecard maintained pursuant to section 4(d) of the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010.
