Mr. Lee (for himself, Mr. Crapo, Mr. Risch, Mr. Cornyn, Mr. Cruz, and Mr. Paul) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

A BILL

To provide that silencers be treated the same as firearms accessories.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Silencers Help Us Save
- 5 Hearing Act" or the "SHUSH Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. EQUAL TREATMENT OF SILENCERS AND FIREARMS.
- 7 (a) In General.—Section 5845(a) of the Internal
- 8 Revenue Code of 1986 is amended by striking "(7) any
- 9 silencer" and all that follows through "; and (8)" and in-
- 10 serting "and (7)".

1	(b)	EFFECTIVE DATE.—
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- 2 (1) In General.—The amendment made by
- 3 this section shall take effect on the date of enact-
- 4 ment of this Act.
- 5 (2) Transfers.—In the case of the tax im-
- 6 posed by section 5811 of the Internal Revenue Code
- 7 of 1986, the amendment made by this section shall
- 8 apply with respect to transfers after October 22,
- 9 2015.

10 SEC. 3. TREATMENT OF CERTAIN SILENCERS.

- 11 Section 5841 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986
- 12 is amended by adding at the end the following:
- 13 "(f) Firearm Silencers.—A person acquiring or
- 14 possessing a firearm silencer in accordance with chapter
- 15 44 of title 18, United States Code, shall be treated as
- 16 meeting any registration and licensing requirements of the
- 17 National Firearms Act (as in effect on the day before the
- 18 date of the enactment of this subsection) with respect to
- 19 such silencer.".

20 SEC. 4. PREEMPTION OF CERTAIN STATE LAWS IN RELA-

- 21 TION TO FIREARM SILENCERS.
- Section 927 of title 18, United States Code, is
- 23 amended by adding at the end the following: "Notwith-
- 24 standing the preceding sentence, a law of a State or a
- 25 political subdivision of a State that, as a condition of law-

1	fully making, transferring, using, possessing, or trans-
2	porting a firearm silencer in or affecting interstate or for-
3	eign commerce, imposes a tax on any such conduct, or a
4	marking, recordkeeping, or registration requirement with
5	respect to the firearm silencer, shall have no force or ef-
6	fect.".
7	SEC. 5. SILENCERS AND MUFFLERS NOT TO BE FEDERALLY
8	REGULATED.
9	(a) Definitions.—Section 921(a) of title 18, United
10	States Code, is amended—
11	(1) in paragraph (3), by striking "(C) any fire-
12	arm muffler or firearm silencer; or (D)" and insert-
13	ing "or (C)"; and
14	(2) by striking paragraph (24).
15	(b) Penalties.—Section 924 of title 18, United
16	States Code, is amended—
17	(1) in subsection $(c)(1)$ —
18	(A) in subparagraph (B)(ii) by striking ",
19	or is equipped with a firearm silencer or fire-
20	arm muffler"; and
21	(B) in subparagraph (C), by striking "or is
22	equipped with a firearm silencer or firearm
23	muffler,"; and
24	(2) in subsection (o), by striking "or is
25	equipped with a firearm silencer or muffler."

1	(c) Carrying of Concealed Firearms by Quali-
2	FIED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS.—Section
3	926B(e)(3) of title 18, United States Code, is amended—
4	(1) in subparagraph (A), by adding "and" at
5	the end;
6	(2) by striking subparagraph (B); and
7	(3) by redesignating subparagraph (C) as sub-
8	paragraph (B).
9	(d) Carrying of Concealed Firearms by Quali-
10	FIED RETIRED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS.—Section
11	926C(e)(1)(C) of title 18, United States Code, is amend-
12	ed—
13	(1) in clause (i) by adding "and" at the end;
14	(2) by striking clause (ii); and
15	(3) by redesignating clause (iii) as clause (ii).

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
