A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Part 3 of Article 3 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 2 Annotated, relating to invasions of privacy, so as to prohibit the use of a device to film under
- 3 or through a person's clothing under certain circumstances; to provide for definitions; to
- 4 provide for penalties; to provide for exceptions; to provide for related matters; to repeal
- 5 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Part 3 of Article 3 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 9 relating to invasions of privacy, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

- 11 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- 12 (1) 'Device' means an instrument or apparatus used for observing, photographing,
- videotaping, recording, or transmitting visual images. Without limiting the generality of
- the foregoing, such term shall specifically include a camera, photographic equipment,
- video equipment, mobile phone, or other similar equipment.
- 16 (2) 'Intimate parts' shall have the same meaning as set forth in Code Section 16-6-22.1.
- 17 (3) 'Person' means an individual who is 16 years of age or older.
- 18 (b)(1) Notwithstanding Code Section 16-11-90, it shall be unlawful for any individual
- 19 <u>to, knowingly and without the consent of the person observed, use or install a device for</u>
- 20 <u>the purpose of surreptitiously observing, photographing, videotaping, filming, or video</u>
- 21 recording such person under or through such person's clothing, for the purpose of viewing
- 22 <u>the intimate parts of the body of or the undergarments worn by such person, under</u>
- 23 <u>circumstances in which such person has a reasonable expectation of privacy, regardless</u>
- of whether such act occurs in a public place.
- 25 (2) It shall be unlawful to disseminate any image or recording with knowledge that it was
- 26 <u>taken or obtained in violation of paragraph (1) of this subsection.</u>

- 27 (c) Any individual convicted of violating this Code section shall be guilty of a felony and,
- 28 upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by imprisonment of not less than one nor more
- 29 than five years, a fine of not more than \$100,000.00, or both, or in the discretion of the
- 30 court, as for a misdemeanor.

- 31 (d) Subsection (b) of this Code section shall not apply to:
- 32 (1) The activities of law enforcement and prosecution agencies in the investigation and
- prosecution of criminal offenses; or
- 34 (2) A retailer that surveils a customer changing room, provided that signage
- 35 <u>conspicuously warns customers of the retailer's surveillance.</u>
- 36 (e) Any violation of this Code section shall constitute a separate offense and shall not
- 37 merge with any other crimes set forth in this title."

39 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
