A BILL

To prohibit actions to carry out the Department of Commerce's pause in the issuance of new export licenses for certain exports under the Commerce Control List.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Protect American Gun
- 5 Exporters Act".

1	SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON ACTIONS TO CARRY OUT THE DE-
2	PARTMENT OF COMMERCE'S PAUSE IN THE
3	ISSUANCE OF NEW EXPORT LICENSES FOR
4	CERTAIN EXPORTS UNDER THE COMMERCE
5	CONTROL LIST.
6	(a) In General.—Effective beginning on the date
7	of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Commerce—
8	(1) may not take any action to carry out the
9	Department of Commerce's assessment or any policy
10	changes resulting from the assessment announced on
11	October 27, 2023, relating to the Department's
12	pause in the issuance of new export licenses for ex-
13	ports of all items controlled under Export Control
14	Classification Numbers 0A501, 0A502, 0A504, and
15	0A505 of the Commerce Control List; and
16	(2) may not take any substantially similar ac-
17	tion to pause or otherwise suspend or prohibit the
18	issuance of new export licenses for exports of any or
19	all items described in paragraph (1).
20	(b) Exception.—The Secretary of Commerce may
21	take an action described in paragraph (1) or (2) of sub-
22	section (a) only if—
23	(1) the action is subject to and meets the re-
24	quirements of—
25	(A) section 553 of title 5, United States
26	Code: and

1	(B) chapter 8 of title 5, commonly known
2	as the "Congressional Review Act"); and
3	(2) before taking the action, the Secretary con-
4	ducts a regulatory impact analysis of the action.

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
