A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Maryland Healthy Working Families Act – Family Member – Definition**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the definition of “family member” for purposes of the Maryland
4 Healthy Working Families Act to include a legal ward of an employee, a legal ward
5 of an employee’s spouse, or a legal guardian of an employee’s spouse; and generally
6 relating to the Healthy Working Families Act.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article – Labor and Employment**

20 3–1301.

21 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

22 (g) “Family member” means:

- 1 (1) a biological child, an adopted child, a foster child, or a stepchild of the
2 employee;
- 3 (2) a child for whom the employee has legal or physical custody or
4 guardianship;
- 5 (3) a child for whom the employee stands in loco parentis, regardless of the
6 child's age;
- 7 (4) a biological parent, an adoptive parent, a foster parent, or a stepparent
8 of the employee or of the employee's spouse;
- 9 (5) the legal guardian **OR WARD** of the employee **OR OF THE EMPLOYEE'S**
10 **SPOUSE**;
- 11 (6) an individual who acted as a parent or stood in loco parentis to the
12 employee or the employee's spouse when the employee or the employee's spouse was a
13 minor;
- 14 (7) the spouse of the employee;
- 15 (8) a biological grandparent, an adopted grandparent, a foster
16 grandparent, or a stepgrandparent of the employee;
- 17 (9) a biological grandchild, an adopted grandchild, a foster grandchild, or a
18 stepgrandchild of the employee; or
- 19 (10) a biological sibling, an adopted sibling, a foster sibling, or a stepsibling
20 of the employee.

21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
22 October 1, 2020.
