## A BILL

- To amend the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 and to establish a congressional budget for fiscal year 2020.

## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Investing for the Peo-
- 5 ple Act of 2019".

## TITLE I—BUDGET ENFORCEMENT

3 SEC. 101. AMENDMENTS TO THE BALANCED BUDGET AND 4 **EMERGENCY DEFICIT CONTROL ACT OF 1985.** 5 (a) REVISED DISCRETIONARY SPENDING LIMITS.— Section 251(c) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency 6 7 Deficit Control Act of 1985 (2 U.S.C. 901(c)) is amended 8 by striking paragraphs (7) and (8) and inserting the fol-9 lowing: 10 "(7) for fiscal year 2020— 11 "(A) for the revised security category, 12 664,000,000,000 in new budget authority; and 13 "(B) for the revised nonsecurity category, 14 \$631,018,000,000 in new budget authority; and "(8) for fiscal year 2021— 15 16 "(A) for the revised security category, 17 \$680,119,000,000; and 18 "(B) for the revised nonsecurity category, 19 \$646,056,000,000;". 20 (b) Overseas Contingency Operations/Global 21 WAR ON TERRORISM ADJUSTMENT LIMIT.—Section 22 251(b)(2) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit 23 Control Act of 1985 (2 U.S.C. 901(b)(2)) is amended in 24 subparagraph (A) by inserting before the period at the end the following: ", except that the adjustment for Overseas 25

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Contingency Operations/Global War on Terrorism for fis cal year 2020 or any subsequent fiscal year shall not ex ceed \$69,000,000,000 for the revised security category or
 \$8,000,000,0000 for the revised nonsecurity category".

5 (c) NEW ADJUSTMENTS FOR THE INTERNAL REV6 ENUE SERVICE AND THE U.S. CENSUS FOR 2020.—Sec7 tion 251(b)(2) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
8 Deficit Control Act of 1985 (2 U.S.C. 901(b)(2)) is
9 amended by adding at the end the following two new sub10 paragraphs:

11 "(G) INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE TAX
12 ENFORCEMENT.—

13 "(i) IN GENERAL.—If a bill or joint 14 resolution making appropriations for a fis-15 cal year is enacted that specifies an 16 amount in the Enforcement account and 17 the Operations Support account for tax en-18 forcement activities, including tax compli-19 ance to address the Federal tax gap, of the 20 Internal Revenue Service of the Depart-21 ment of the Treasury, then the adjustment 22 for that fiscal year shall be the additional 23 new budget authority provided in that Act 24 for such purpose for that fiscal year, but 25 shall not exceed—

1	"(I) for fiscal year 2020,
2	\$400,000,000; and
3	"(II) for fiscal year 2021,
4	\$750,000,000.
5	"(ii) DEFINITION.—As used in this
6	subparagraph, the term 'additional new
7	budget authority' means the amount pro-
8	vided for a fiscal year, in excess of
9	\$8,584,000,000, in an appropriation Act
10	and specified for tax enforcement activi-
11	ties, including tax compliance to address
12	the Federal tax gap, of the Internal Rev-
13	enue Service.
14	"(H) The 2020 census.—
15	"(i) IN GENERAL.—If a bill or joint
16	resolution making appropriations for fiscal
17	year 2020 is enacted that specifies an
18	amount for the 2020 Census in the Peri-
19	odic Censuses and Programs account of
20	the Bureau of the Census of the Depart-
21	ment of Commerce, then the adjustment
22	for that fiscal year shall be the new budget
23	authority provided in that Act for such
24	purpose for fiscal year 2020, but shall not

25 exceed \$7,500,000,000.

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1	"(ii) DEFINITION.—As used in this
2	subparagraph, the term 'new budget au-
3	thority' means the amount provided for fis-
4	cal year 2020 in an appropriation Act and
5	specified to pay for expenses associated
6	with 2020 Census operations.".
7	(d) Direct Spending Adjustments for Fiscal
8	Years 2020 and 2021.—Section 251A of the Balanced
9	Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 (2
10	U.S.C. 901a), is amended—
11	(1) in paragraph $(5)(B)$ , in the matter pre-
12	ceding clause (i), by striking "and (12)" and insert-
13	ing ", (12), and (13)"; and
14	(2) by adding at the end the following:
15	"(13) Implementing direct spending re-
16	DUCTIONS FOR FISCAL YEARS 2020 AND 2021.—(A)
17	OMB shall make the calculations necessary to imple-
18	ment the direct spending reductions calculated pur-
19	suant to paragraphs (3) and (4) without regard to
20	the amendment made to section 251(c) revising the
21	discretionary spending limits for fiscal years 2020
22	and 2021 by the Investing for the People Act of
23	2019.
24	"(B) Paragraph (5)(B) shall not be imple-

25 mented for fiscal years 2020 and 2021.".

# TITLE II—ESTABLISHING A CONGRESSIONAL BUDGET

3 SEC. 201. FISCAL YEAR 2020 BUDGET RESOLUTION.

4 (a) FISCAL YEAR 2020.—For the purpose of enforc-5 ing the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 for fiscal year 2020, the allocations, aggregates, and levels provided for 6 7 in subsection (b) shall apply in the House of Representa-8 tives in the same manner as for a concurrent resolution 9 on the budget for fiscal year 2020 with appropriate budg-10 etary levels for fiscal year 2020 and for fiscal years 2021 11 through 2029.

12 (b) COMMITTEE ALLOCATIONS, AGGREGATES, AND 13 LEVELS.—In the House of Representatives, the Chair of 14 the Committee on the Budget shall submit a statement 15 for publication in the Congressional Record as soon as 16 practicable, containing—

17 (1) for the Committee on Appropriations, com-18 mittee allocations for fiscal year 2020 consistent 19 with discretionary spending limits set forth in sec-20 tion 251(c)(7) of the Balanced Budget and Emer-21 gency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended by 22 this Act, and the outlays flowing therefrom, and 23 committee allocations for fiscal year 2020 for cur-24 rent law mandatory budget authority and outlays,

for the purpose of enforcing section 302 of the Con gressional Budget Act of 1974;

3 (2) for all committees of that House other than 4 the Committee on Appropriations, committee alloca-5 tions for fiscal year 2020 and for the period of fiscal 6 years 2020 through 2029 consistent with the most 7 recent baseline of the Congressional Budget Office, 8 as adjusted, to the extent practicable, for the budg-9 etary effects of any provision of law enacted during 10 the period beginning on the date such baseline is 11 issued and ending on the date of submission of such 12 statement, for the purpose of enforcing section 302 13 of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974;

(3) aggregate spending levels for fiscal year
2020 in accordance with the allocations established
under paragraphs (1) and (2), for the purpose of enforcing section 311 of the Congressional Budget Act
of 1974; and

(4) aggregate revenue levels for fiscal year 2020
and for the period of fiscal years 2020 through 2029
consistent with the most recent baseline of the Congressional Budget Office, as adjusted, to the extent
practicable, for the budgetary effects of any provision of law enacted during the period beginning on
the date such baseline is issued and ending on the

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date of submission of such statement, for the pur pose of enforcing section 311 of the Congressional
 Budget Act of 1974.

4 (c) ADDITIONAL MATTER.—The statement referred
5 to in subsection (b) may also include for fiscal year 2020,
6 the matter contained in the provisions referred to in sub7 section (e).

8 (d) ADJUSTMENTS.—The Chair of the Committee on 9 the Budget of the House of Representatives may adjust 10 the allocations, aggregates, and other budgetary levels in-11 cluded in the statement referred to in subsection (b)—

(1) to reflect changes resulting from the Congressional Budget Office's updates to its baseline for
fiscal years 2020 through 2029; or

(2) for any bill, joint resolution, amendment, or
conference report by the amounts provided in such
measure if such measure would not increase the deficit for either of the following time periods: fiscal
year 2020 to fiscal year 2024 or fiscal year 2020 to
fiscal year 2029.

(e) APPLICATION.—Upon submission of the statement referred to in subsection (b), all references to allocations, aggregates, or other appropriate levels in "this concurrent resolution" in sections 5201, 5202, and 5203 of
the House Concurrent Resolution 71 (115th Congress),

specified in section 30104(f)(1) of the Bipartisan Budget 1 2 Act of 2018, and continued in effect by section 103(m)3 of House Resolution 6 (116th Congress), shall be treated 4 for all purposes in the House of Representatives as ref-5 erences to the allocations, aggregates, or other appropriate levels contained in the statement referred to in subsection 6 7 (b), as adjusted in accordance with this section or any 8 other Act.

### 9 SEC. 202. LIMITATION ON ADVANCE APPROPRIATIONS.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in subsection
(b), any general appropriation bill or bill or joint resolution continuing appropriations, or amendment thereto or
conference report thereon, may not provide an advance appropriation.

(b) EXCEPTIONS.—An advance appropriation may be
provided for programs, activities or accounts identified in
lists submitted for printing in the Congressional Record
by the Chair of the Committee on the Budget—

(1) for fiscal year 2021, under the heading "Accounts Identified for Advance Appropriations" in an
aggregate amount not to exceed \$28,852,000,000 in
new budget authority, and for fiscal year 2022, accounts separately identified under the same heading;
and

1 (2) for fiscal year 2021, under the heading 2 "Veterans Accounts Identified for Advance Appropriations" in an aggregate amount not to exceed 3 4 \$87,636,650,000 in new budget authority.

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(c) DEFINITION.—The term "advance appropriation" 5 means any new discretionary budget authority provided in 6 a general appropriation bill or bill or joint resolution con-7 8 tinuing appropriations for fiscal year 2020, or any amend-9 ment thereto or conference report thereon, that first be-10 comes available following fiscal year 2020.

#### SEC. 203. EXERCISE OF RULEMAKING POWERS. 11

12 Sections 201 and 202 are enacted by the House of 13 Representatives—

14 (1) as an exercise of the rulemaking power of 15 the House of Representatives, and as such they shall 16 be considered as part of the rules of the House of 17 Representatives, and such rules shall supersede 18 other rules only to the extent that they are incon-19 sistent therewith; and

20 (2) with full recognition of the constitutional 21 right of the House of Representatives to change 22 such rules at any time, in the same manner, and to 23 the same extent as in the case of any other rule of 24 the House of Representatives.

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
