The House Committee on Retirement offers the following substitute to HB 336:

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 7 of Chapter 3 of Title 47 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to retirement allowances, disability benefits, and spouses' benefits, so as to permit
- 3 certain public employers to employ beneficiaries of the Teachers Retirement System of
- 4 Georgia in certain high-need capacities and under limited conditions; to require such
- 5 employers to make employer and employee contributions on behalf of such employed
- 6 beneficiaries; to provide for conditions and limitations for beneficiaries who return to service
- 7 full time as teachers; to provide for a definition; to provide for related matters; to provide
- 8 conditions for an effective date and automatic repeal; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 9 purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

11 SECTION 1.

- 12 Article 7 of Chapter 3 of Title 47 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 13 retirement allowances, disability benefits, and spouses' benefits, is amended by adding a new
- 14 Code section to read as follows:
- 15 "47-3-127.1.
- 16 (a) From July 1, 2020, until June 30, 2025, notwithstanding the provisions of Code
- 17 Section 47-3-127, to the extent and under the conditions provided for in this Code section,
- 18 <u>a public school system may employ a beneficiary as a certified teacher of pre-kindergarten</u>
- 19 through grade 12 who has as his or her primary responsibility the academic instruction of
- 20 students in a classroom in science, technology, engineering, arts, math, or an area of
- 21 <u>highest need, provided that at least one year has expired from the effective date of such</u>
- 22 <u>beneficiary's retirement and he or she was not restored to service as a teacher pursuant to</u>
- 23 <u>Code Section 47-3-127.</u>
- 24 (b)(1) An individual employed as described in subsection (a) of this Code section shall
- 25 remain a beneficiary and shall continue to receive his or her retirement allowance and any
- 26 <u>postretirement benefit adjustments for which he or she is eligible; provided, however, that</u>

27 <u>such service shall not constitute creditable service and shall not entitle such beneficiary</u>

- 28 <u>to a recomputation of retirement benefits upon cessation of such service.</u>
- 29 (2) It shall be the duty of each beneficiary to notify an employer of his or her status as
- a beneficiary prior to accepting employment with such employer.
- 31 (c)(1) Within 30 days of employing a beneficiary pursuant to this Code section, such
- 32 <u>employer shall notify the board of trustees of such beneficiary's name, the amount of his</u>
- or her earnable compensation, a description of any other forms of remuneration to be
- 34 made, the number of hours to be worked, job responsibilities, and other such information
- as the board of trustees may prescribe.
- 36 (2) An employer that employs a beneficiary pursuant to subsection (a) of this Code
- 37 <u>section shall pay to the retirement system an amount equal to the product of:</u>
- 38 (A) The combination of the rate required by this chapter for employer contributions
- 39 <u>and employee contributions; and</u>
- 40 (B) The earnable compensation of such beneficiary.
- 41 (3) A beneficiary shall not receive creditable service from or access to contributions
- 42 made as a result of payments required by paragraph (2) of this subsection, and he or she
- shall be considered by the retirement system solely as a beneficiary.
- 44 (4) If an employer that is obligated to make contributions or reimbursements to the
- 45 retirement system pursuant to this Code section fails to make such contributions, any
- 46 <u>unpaid amounts shall be deducted from any funds payable to such employer by the state,</u>
- 47 <u>including without limitation the Department of Education and the Board of Regents of</u>
- 48 <u>the University System of Georgia, and shall be paid to the retirement system.</u>
- 49 (d)(1) As used in this Code section, 'area of highest need' means one of the three content
- areas for which there are the greatest percentages of unfilled positions for classroom
- 51 <u>teachers in this state.</u>
- 52 (2) The areas of highest need shall be determined annually by the Department of
- 53 Education after consultation with the Professional Standards Commission. Such
- determination shall be based upon a five-year average review of a survey reported by
- 55 <u>local school systems to the Department of Education. The areas of highest need shall be</u>
- 56 reported to the retirement system on an annual basis from July 1, 2020, until July 1, 2024.
- 57 (e) The provisions of this Code section shall not become part of the employment contract
- and shall be subject to future legislation."
- 59 SECTION 2.
- 60 This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2020, only if it is determined to have been
- 61 concurrently funded as provided in Chapter 20 of Title 47 of the Official Code of Georgia
- Annotated, the "Public Retirement Systems Standards Law"; otherwise, this Act shall not

63 become effective and shall be automatically repealed in its entirety on July 1, 2020, as

64 required by subsection (a) of Code Section 47-20-50.

66 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
