A BILL

To amend sections 101.27, 141.01, 141.011, 141.04,	1
325.03, 325.04, 325.06, 325.08, 325.09, 325.10,	2
325.11, 325.14, 325.15, 325.18, 505.24, 507.09,	3
742.63, and 3501.12 and to enact sections	4
101.61, 107.71, and 124.824 of the Revised Code	5
to revise the payments that surviving family	6
members receive from the Ohio Public Safety	7
Officers Death Benefit Fund and to permit	8
surviving spouses and children to participate in	9
the health, dental, and vision benefits offered	10
to state employees as if the survivors were	11
employees of this state; to increase the	12
compensation of elected public officers through	13
2028; to create the Public Office Compensation	14
Advisory Commission; to create the Office of	15
InnovateOhio; to allow the Lieutenant Governor	16
to receive the salary of the head of an office	17
within the Governor's office in lieu of the	18
Lieutenant Governor's statutory salary; and to	19
declare an emergency.	20

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 101.27, 141.01, 141.011, 141.04, 21
325.03, 325.04, 325.06, 325.08, 325.09, 325.10, 325.11, 325.14, 22
325.15, 325.18, 505.24, 507.09, 742.63, and 3501.12 be amended 23
and sections 101.61, 107.71, and 124.824 of the Revised Code be 24
enacted to read as follows: 25

Sec. 101.27. (A) (1) Every member of the senate, except the 26
members elected president, president pro tempore, assistant 27
president pro tempore, majority whip, minority leader, assistant 28
minority leader, minority whip, and assistant minority whip, 29
shall receive as compensation a salary of ~~fifty-one sixty-three~~ 30
thousand ~~six hundred seventy-four seven~~ dollars a year during 31
the senator's term of office. Every member of the house of 32
representatives, except the members elected speaker, speaker pro 33
tempore, majority floor leader, assistant majority floor leader, 34
majority whip, assistant majority whip, minority leader, 35
assistant minority leader, minority whip, and assistant minority 36
whip, shall receive as compensation a salary of ~~fifty-one sixty-~~ 37
~~three~~ thousand ~~six hundred seventy-four seven~~ dollars a year 38
during the representative's term of office. Such salaries shall 39
be paid in equal monthly installments during such term. All 40
monthly payments shall be made on or before the fifth day of 41
each month. Upon the death of any member of the general assembly 42
during the member's term of office, any unpaid salary due such 43
member for the remainder of the member's term shall be paid to 44
the member's surviving spouse, children, mother, or father, in 45
the order in which the relationship is set forth in this section 46
in monthly installments. 47

(2) Each member shall receive a travel reimbursement per 48

mile each way, at the same mileage rate allowed for the 49
reimbursement of travel expenses of state agents as provided by 50
rule of the director of budget and management pursuant to 51
division (B) of section 126.31 of the Revised Code, for mileage 52
not more than once a week during the session for travel incurred 53
by a member from and to the member's place of residence, by the 54
most direct highway route of public travel to and from the seat 55
of government, to be paid quarterly on the last day of March, 56
June, September, and December of each year. 57

(3) The member of the senate elected president and the 58
member of the house of representatives elected speaker shall 59
each receive as compensation a salary of ~~eighty-ninety-eight~~ 60
thousand ~~five-two~~ hundred ~~forty-nine-fourteen~~ dollars a year 61
during the president's or speaker's term of office. 62

The member of the senate elected president pro tempore, 63
the member of the senate elected minority leader, the member of 64
the house of representatives elected speaker pro tempore, and 65
the member of the house of representatives elected minority 66
leader shall each receive as compensation a salary of ~~seventy-~~ 67
~~three-eighty-nine~~ thousand ~~four-six~~ hundred ~~ninety-three-twelve~~ 68
dollars a year during the member's term of office. ~~The-~~ 69

The member of the house of representatives elected 70
majority floor leader and the member of the senate elected 71
assistant president pro tempore shall each receive as 72
compensation a salary of ~~sixty-nine-eighty-four~~ thousand ~~two-~~ 73
~~four~~ hundred ~~twenty-seven-ten~~ dollars a year during the member's 74
term of office. ~~The-~~ 75

The member of the senate elected assistant minority leader 76
and the member of the house of representatives elected assistant 77
minority leader shall each receive as compensation a salary of 78

~~fifteen~~ dollars a year during the member's term of office. ~~The~~ 79 80

The member of the senate elected majority whip and the 81
member of the house of representatives elected assistant 82

dollars a year during the member's term of office. ~~The~~ 85

The member of the senate elected minority whip, the member 86
of the house of representatives elected majority whip, and the 87

shall each receive as compensation a salary of ~~sixty-seventy-~~ 89
~~four~~ thousand ~~seven-hundred-six~~ ~~twenty~~ dollars a year during the 90
member's term of office. ~~The~~ 91

The member of the house of representatives elected 92
assistant majority whip shall receive as compensation a salary 93
of ~~fifty-six-sixty-eight~~ thousand ~~four-eight~~ hundred ~~forty-three-~~ 94
~~twenty-two~~ dollars a year during the member's term of office. 95
~~The~~ 96

The member of the house of representatives elected 97
assistant minority whip and the member of the senate elected 98
assistant minority whip shall each receive a salary of ~~fifty-~~ 99
~~four-sixty-five~~ thousand ~~sixty-nine~~ hundred ~~sixteen~~ dollars a 100
year during the member's term of office. 101

(4) The chairperson of the finance committee of each house 102
shall receive an additional sum of ~~ten-thirteen~~ thousand five 103
hundred dollars annually. The chairperson of each standing 104
committee of each house other than the finance committee shall 105
receive an additional sum of ~~six-nine~~ thousand ~~five-hundred-~~ 106
dollars annually. The chairperson of each standing subcommittee 107

of a finance committee shall receive an additional sum of ~~six-~~ 108
nine thousand ~~five hundred~~ dollars annually. The vice- 109
chairperson of the finance committee of each house shall receive 110
an additional sum of ~~five~~ seven thousand five hundred dollars 111
annually. The ranking minority member of the finance committee 112
of each house shall receive an additional sum of ~~six~~ nine 113
thousand ~~five hundred~~ dollars annually. The ranking minority 114
member of each standing subcommittee of a finance committee 115
shall receive an additional sum of ~~five~~ six thousand seven 116
hundred fifty dollars annually. The chairperson of each standing 117
subcommittee of each house other than a standing subcommittee of 118
the finance committee shall receive an additional sum of ~~five-~~ 119
six thousand seven hundred fifty dollars annually. The vice- 120
chairperson and ranking minority member of each standing 121
committee of each house other than the finance committee shall 122
each receive an additional sum of ~~five~~ six thousand seven 123
hundred fifty dollars annually. Except for the ranking minority 124
member of each standing subcommittee of a finance committee, the 125
ranking minority member of each standing subcommittee of each 126
house shall receive an additional sum of ~~two~~ three thousand ~~five-~~ 127
two hundred fifty dollars annually. 128

No member may receive more than one additional sum for 129
serving as chairperson, vice-chairperson, or ranking minority 130
member of a standing committee or standing subcommittee, 131
regardless of the number of standing committees or standing 132
subcommittees on which the member serves as chairperson, vice- 133
chairperson, or ranking minority member. 134

(5) If a member is absent without leave, or is not excused 135
on the member's return, there shall be deducted from the 136
member's compensation twenty dollars for each day's absence. 137

(C) As used in this section:

~~(1) "Consumer price index" means the consumer price index prepared by the United States bureau of labor statistics (U.S. city average for urban wage earners and clerical workers: all items, 1982-1984=100), or, if that index is no longer published, a generally available comparable index.~~

~~(2) "Finance", "finance committee" means the finance committee of the senate and the finance appropriations finance committee of the house of representatives.~~

Sec. 101.61. (A) (1) The public office compensation advisory commission is created. The commission consists of the following nine voting members: two members appointed by the governor; two members appointed by the president of the senate; two members appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives; one member appointed by the minority leader of the senate; one member appointed by the minority leader of the house of representatives; and one member appointed by the chief justice of the supreme court.

(2) The following are not eligible to be appointed as a member of the commission:

(a) An officer or employee of the state or a political subdivision of the state or a spouse, child, sibling, or parent of an officer or employee of the state or a political subdivision of the state;

(b) An individual who, within twelve months before appointment, was a candidate for election to a public office in the state;

(c) An individual who engages during at least a portion of the individual's time to actively advocate legislation on behalf

of another including a legislative agent as defined under 194
section 101.70 of the Revised Code, or an executive agency 195
lobbyist as defined under section 121.60 of the Revised Code. 196

As used in this section, "actively advocate" has the 197
meaning defined in section 101.70 of the Revised Code. 198

(3) Terms of members of the commission are for two years. 199
Members may not serve more than four consecutive terms. The 200
commission chairperson shall be selected annually not later than 201
the first day of January by vote of at least five members of the 202
commission. Members are not entitled to compensation, but shall 203
be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses incurred in the 204
performance of commission duties. A vacancy among the members of 205
the commission shall be filled in the manner prescribed for the 206
original appointment. A member may be removed from the 207
commission only by that member's designated appointing authority 208
and only if the member's designated appointing authority finds 209
that the member is inefficient or derelict in the discharge of 210
the member's duties. 211

(B) (1) The public office compensation advisory commission 212
shall meet as necessary to review the current compensation of 213
each public office in the state whose compensation is set by the 214
general assembly under the Ohio Constitution, Section 20 or 31 215
of Article II, Section 19 of Article III, or Section 6 of 216
Article IV. The commission shall consider relevant factors such 217
as the amount of compensation paid to similarly skilled 218
individuals in the private sector, the amount of compensation 219
paid to individuals in comparable public offices in other 220
states, and the current financial condition of and within this 221
state. 222

(2) Annually, not later than the fifteenth day of October, 223

the commission, by vote of at least five of its members, shall 224
prepare a proposed compensation plan and a report of the 225
proposed compensation plan detailing the commission's 226
recommendations. Annually, not later than the fifteenth day of 227
October, the commission shall submit the plan and the report to 228
the president and minority leader of the senate and to the 229
speaker and minority leader of the house of representatives. 230

Sec. 107.71. The office of innovateohio is hereby 231
established within the office of the governor. The governor 232
shall appoint a director of the office who shall receive an 233
annual salary equal to the maximum compensation specified in pay 234
range 48 of salary schedule E-2 in division (B)(1) of section 235
124.152 of the Revised Code. The governor shall appoint 236
necessary professional, technical, and clerical personnel. The 237
employees serve at the pleasure of the governor. The governor 238
shall set the duties of the office. 239

Sec. 124.824. (A) As used in this section, "death benefit 240
fund recipient" means any recipient of a death benefit paid 241
under section 742.63 of the Revised Code except a parent who 242
receives a death benefit paid under division (E) of that 243
section. 244

(B)(1) Except as otherwise provided under division (B)(3) 245
of this section, a death benefit fund recipient may elect to 246
participate in any health, medical, hospital, dental, surgical, 247
or vision benefit the department of administrative services 248
contracts for under section 124.82 of the Revised Code or 249
otherwise provides for the benefit of state employees who are 250
paid directly by warrant of the director of budget and 251
management. A death benefit fund recipient who elects to 252
participate in a benefit under this section shall do both of the 253

following: 254

(a) File a notice with the department of the death benefit 255
fund recipient's election to participate that specifies the 256
benefits or combination of benefits in which the recipient 257
elects to participate. 258

(b) Pay to the department the percentage of the premium or 259
cost for the applicable benefits that would be paid by a state 260
employee who elects that coverage. 261

(2) A parent, guardian, custodian, or other person 262
responsible for the care of a death benefit fund recipient who 263
is under eighteen years of age or who is a surviving child 264
entitled to extended benefits under division (H) (3) of section 265
742.63 of the Revised Code due to disability may file the 266
election required by division (B) (1) of this section on the 267
death benefit fund recipient's behalf. 268

(3) A death benefit fund recipient is ineligible to 269
participate in a health, medical, hospital, dental, surgical, or 270
vision benefit under division (B) (1) of this section if the 271
recipient is eligible to enroll in the medicare program 272
established by Title XVIII of the "Social Security Act," 79 273
Stat. 291 (1965), 42 U.S.C. 1395c, as amended. 274

(C) For each death benefit fund recipient who participates 275
in health, medical, hospital, dental, surgical, or vision 276
benefits under division (B) of this section, the department 277
shall pay the percentage of the premium or cost for the 278
applicable benefits that would be paid by a state employer for a 279
state employee who elects that coverage. 280

(D) The director of administrative services shall 281
prescribe procedures for the administration of benefits for 282

death benefit fund recipients under this section, including the 283
development of required forms for death benefit fund recipients 284
to enroll, disenroll, or re-enroll in benefits under this 285
section. 286

(E) The board of trustees of the Ohio police and fire 287
pension fund shall provide any information to the department 288
that the department requires to provide benefits under this 289
section, including information regarding the identities, ages, 290
and family relationships of death benefit fund recipients. 291

Sec. 141.01. Except as provided in section 141.011 of the 292

These salaries shall be paid according to the schedule 307
established in division (B) of section 124.15 of the Revised 308
Code. Upon the death of an elected executive officer of the 309
state listed in divisions (A) to (F) of this section during the 310

officer's term of office, an amount shall be paid in accordance 311
with section 2113.04 of the Revised Code, or to the officer's 312
estate. The amount shall equal the amount of the salary that the 313
officer would have received during the remainder of the 314
officer's unexpired term or an amount equal to the salary of the 315
office held for two years, whichever is less. 316

Unless a higher salary is explicitly established by 317
statute, no officer or employee elected or appointed, and no 318
officer or employee of any state agency or state-assisted 319
institution except a state institution of higher education or 320
the Ohio board of regents for the positions of chancellor and 321
vice chancellor for health affairs, shall be paid as an officer 322
or employee, whether from appropriated or nonappropriated funds, 323
a total salary that exceeds fifty-five thousand dollars per 324
calendar year. This paragraph does not apply to the salaries of 325
individuals holding or appointed to endowed academic chairs or 326
endowed academic professorships at a state-supported institution 327
of higher education or to the salaries of individuals paid under 328
schedule C of section 124.15 or under schedule E-2 of section 329
124.152 of the Revised Code. 330
