A BILL

To amend the Elder Abuse Prevention and Prosecution Act to improve the prevention of elder abuse and exploitation of individuals with Alzheimer's disease and related dementias.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- This Act may be cited as the "Promoting Alzheimer's
- 5 Awareness to Prevent Elder Abuse Act".

1	SEC. 2. ADDRESSING ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE IN BEST PRAC-
2	TICES.
3	(a) In General.—Section 101(b) of the Elder Abuse
4	Prevention and Prosecution Act (34 U.S.C. 21711(b)) is
5	amended—
6	(1) by redesignating subparagraphs (A), (B),
7	and (C) of paragraph (2) as clauses (i), (ii), and
8	(iii), respectively, and adjusting the margin accord-
9	ingly;
10	(2) by redesignating paragraphs (1), (2), and
11	(3) as subparagraphs (A), (B), and (C), respectively,
12	and adjusting the margin accordingly;
13	(3) by striking "Not later than" and inserting
14	the following:
15	"(1) In general.—Not later than";
16	(4) in paragraph (1)(B), as so redesignated—
17	(A) in clause (ii), by inserting ", including
18	witnesses who have Alzheimer's disease and re-
19	lated dementias" after "other legal issues"; and
20	(B) in clause (iii), by striking "elder abuse
21	cases," and inserting "elder abuse cases (in-
22	cluding victims and witnesses who have Alz-
23	heimer's disease and related dementias),"; and
24	(5) by adding at the end the following:
25	"(2) Training materials.—

1	"(A) IN GENERAL.—In creating or com-
2	piling replication guides and training materials
3	under paragraph (1)(B), the Elder Justice Co-
4	ordinator shall consult with the Secretary of
5	Health and Human Services, State, local, and
6	Tribal adult protective services, aging, social
7	and human services agencies, Federal, State
8	local, and Tribal law enforcement agencies, and
9	nationally recognized nonprofit associations
10	with relevant expertise, as appropriate.
11	"(B) UPDATING.—The Elder Justice Coor-
12	dinator shall—
13	"(i) review the best practices identi-
14	fied and replication guides and training
15	materials created or compiled under para-
16	graph (1)(B) to determine if the replica-
17	tion guides or training materials require
18	updating; and
19	"(ii) perform any necessary updating
20	of the replication guides or training mate-
21	rials.".
22	(b) APPLICABILITY.—The amendments made by sub-
23	section (a) shall—
24	(1) take effect on the date of enactment of this
25	Act; and

1	(2) apply on and after the date that is 1 year
2	after the date of enactment of this Act.
3	SEC. 3. REPORT ON OUTREACH.
4	(a) In General.—Section 101(c)(2) of the Elder
5	Abuse Prevention and Prosecution Act (34 U.S.C.
6	21711(c)(2)) is amended—
7	(1) by redesignating subparagraphs (A) through
8	(D) as clauses (i) through (iv), respectively, and ad-
9	justing the margin accordingly;
10	(2) by striking "a report detailing" and insert-
11	ing the following: "a report—
12	"(A) detailing"; and
13	(3) by adding at the end the following:
14	"(B) with respect to the report by the At-
15	torney General, including a link to the publicly
16	available best practices identified under sub-
17	section (b)(1)(B) and the replication guides and
18	training materials created or compiled under
19	such subsection.".
20	(b) APPLICABILITY.—The amendments made by sub-
21	section (a) shall apply with respect to the report under
22	section 101(c)(2) of the Elder Abuse Prevention and Pros-
23	ecution Act (34 U S C 21711(c)(2)) submitted during the

- 1 second year beginning after the date of enactment of this
- 2 Act, and each year thereafter.

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
