Vehicle Laws - Equipment and Inspections - Standards and Requirements

3 FOR the purpose of altering for vehicle operation and inspection purposes the standards 4 for the authorized placement of certain materials on certain windows of certain 5 vehicles; prohibiting the use of certain equipment on a highway under certain 6 circumstances; altering certain standards and requirements governing headlamps, 7 stop lamps, turn signal lamps, light or signal devices, backup lamps, brakes, and 8 windshield washers on certain vehicles; establishing a certain maximum period of 9 validity for a medical certification that authorizes enhanced window tinting on a 10 vehicle; providing for the construction of a certain provision of law that authorizes 11 enhanced window tinting on a vehicle; altering the standards and requirements for 12 applications, testing, and administrative enforcement for inspection mechanic 13 licenses; repealing certain obsolete or redundant provisions of law governing vehicle equipment; making certain stylistic changes and technical corrections; and generally 14 15 relating to standards and requirements for vehicle equipment and inspections.
