- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 (e) (3) (i) The Department, in consultation with the University of 21 Maryland Center for Environmental Science, as part of its fishery management plan for 22 oysters, shall conduct a study to:

231.Identify all available data that may be used to conduct a24stock assessment;

Conduct a stock assessment that provides guidance for the $\mathbf{5}$ development of biological reference points that are based on the biological characteristics 6 of the oyster population and other appropriate factors that affect the oyster population; 7 Identify objective and measurable means to determine if 4. 8 the public ovster fishery is operating within the biological reference points developed under this paragraph; and 9 10 5. Submit the study to a peer review panel composed of stock 11 assessment experts. 12(ii) Based on a determination made under item (i)4 of this paragraph 13and the authority of the Department under this section, the Department, through a public process in collaboration with the commercial ovster industry, conservation organizations, 14and other concerned stakeholders, shall identify management strategies to address the 15maintenance of a sustainable oyster population and fishery. 1617The Department shall submit to the Governor, the Oyster (iii) Advisory Commission, and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, 18 19the General Assembly, with respect to the study required under this paragraph and any 20proposed or implemented oyster management strategies: 211. An interim progress report on or before December 1, 2016; 222. A subsequent interim progress report on or before 23December 1, 2017; and 243. A final report on or before December 1, 2018. THE DEPARTMENT MAY NOT TAKE ANY ACTION TO REDUCE OR 25(4) ALTER THE OYSTER SANCTUARIES ESTABLISHED IN "OYSTER SANCTUARIES OF THE 26CHESAPEAKE BAY AND ITS TIDAL TRIBUTARIES (SEPTEMBER 2010)" UNTIL THE 2728DEPARTMENT HAS DEVELOPED A FISHERIES MANAGEMENT PLAN FOR THE 29SCIENTIFIC MANAGEMENT OF THE OYSTER STOCK FOLLOWING THE COMPLETION OF 30 **ITS REPORTS IN ACCORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION.** SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 31321, 2017.

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
