

## 115TH CONGRESS H.R. 6178

To amend the Motor Carrier Safety Improvement Act of 1999 with respect to exemptions from certain motor carrier regulations, and for other purposes.

Mr. Crawford (for himself, Mr. Bishop of Georgia, and Mr. Westerman) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

## A BILL

To amend the Motor Carrier Safety Improvement Act of 1999 with respect to exemptions from certain motor carrier regulations, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Honest Operators Un-
- 5 dertake Road Safety Act" or the "HOURS Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. TRANSPORTATION OF AGRICULTURAL COMMOD-
- 7 ITIES AND FARM SUPPLIES.
- 8 Section 229 of the Motor Carrier Safety Improve-
- 9 ment Act of 1999 (49 U.S.C. 31136 note) is amended—

1	(1) in subsection (a)(1), by striking "during
2	planting and harvest periods, as determined by each
3	State,"; and
4	(2) in subsection (e)(8), by striking "during the
5	planting and harvesting seasons within each State
6	as determined by the State, and livestock feed at
7	any time of the year" and inserting "and livestock
8	feed".
9	SEC. 3. SHORT-HAUL OPERATIONS.
10	Not later than 180 days after the date of enactment
11	of this Act, the Secretary of Transportation shall issue or
12	revise regulations to ensure that a driver is exempt from
13	the requirements of sections 395.8 and 395.11 of title 49
14	Code of Federal Regulations (or any successor regula-
15	tions), if—
16	(1) the driver operates within a 150 air-mile ra-
17	dius of the normal work reporting location;
18	(2) the driver (except a driver-salesperson)—
19	(A) if driving a property-carrying commer-
20	cial motor vehicle, returns to the work reporting
21	location and is released from work within 14
22	consecutive hours; and
23	(B) if driving a passenger-carrying com-
24	mercial motor vehicle, returns to the work re-

1	porting location and is released from work with-
2	in 12 consecutive hours;
3	(3) the driver—
4	(A) if driving a property-carrying commer-
5	cial motor vehicle, has at least 10 consecutive
6	hours off duty separating each 14 hours or
7	duty; and
8	(B) if driving a passenger-carrying com-
9	mercial motor vehicle, has at least 8 consecutive
10	hours off duty separating each 12 hours on
11	duty;
12	(4) the driver—
13	(A) if driving a property-carrying commer-
14	cial motor vehicle, does not exceed the max-
15	imum driving time specified in section
16	395.3(a)(3) of title 49, Code of Federal Regula-
17	tions (or any successor regulation), following 10
18	consecutive hours off duty; and
19	(B) if driving a passenger-carrying com-
20	mercial motor vehicle, does not exceed 10 hours
21	maximum driving time following 8 consecutive
22	hours off duty; and
23	(5) the motor carrier that employs the driver
24	maintains and retains for a period of 6 months accu-
25	rate and true time records showing the

1	(A) time the driver reports for duty each
2	day;
3	(B) total number of hours the driver is on
4	duty each day;
5	(C) time the driver is released from duty
6	each day; and
7	(D) total time for the preceding 7 days in
8	accordance with section 395.8(j)(2) of title 49,
9	Code of Federal Regulations (or any successor
10	regulation), for drivers used for the first time
11	or intermittently.
12	SEC. 4. SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS.
13	Not later than 180 days after the date of enactment
14	of this Act, the Secretary of Transportation shall issue or
15	revise regulations to ensure that a driver or motor carrier
16	subject to the use of an electronic logging device pursuant
17	to section 31137 of title 49, United States Code, shall only
18	be required, for purposes of Federal hours of service re-
19	quirements, to obtain and retain supporting documenta-
20	tion regarding the start and end times of each applicable
21	daily on-duty period.
22	SEC. 5. SLEEPER BERTHS.
23	Before the date that is 2 years after the date of en-
24	actment of this Act, the requirements under section

 $25\ 31136(g)(1)$  of title 49, United States Code, shall not

- 1 apply to a rulemaking regarding hours of service require-
- 2 ments as they relate to sleeper berths for property-car-

3 rying commercial motor vehicle drivers.

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
