## AN ACT

- To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a special resource study of Fort Ontario in the State of New York.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Fort Ontario Study3 Act".

#### 4 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

5 Congress makes the following findings:

6 (1) From 1755 until 1814, Fort Ontario and 7 three previous fortifications built on the site of the 8 Fort in Oswego, New York, on the shore of Lake 9 Ontario were used as military installations during 10 the French and Indian War, the Revolutionary War, 11 and the War of 1812.

(2) The original fort, erected by the British in
1755, was destroyed by French forces in 1756. The
fort was rebuilt and subsequently destroyed during
both the American Revolution and the War of 1812.
The star-shaped fort was constructed on the site of
the original fortifications in the 1840s, with improvements made from 1863 through 1872.

19 (3) The United States Armed Forces began ex20 panding Fort Ontario in the early 20th century and
21 by 1941, approximately 125 buildings stood at the
22 fort.

(4) On June 9, 1944, President Franklin D.
Roosevelt announced that Fort Ontario would serve
as the Nation's only Emergency Refugee Camp during World War II. From August of 1944 until Feb•HR 46 EH

ruary 1946, nearly 1,000 refugees were sheltered at
 Fort Ontario.

3 (5) Fort Ontario was conveyed from the Fed4 eral Government to the State of New York in 1946;
5 it was used to house World War II veterans and
6 their families and then converted to a State historic
7 site in 1953.

8 (6) A post cemetery containing the graves of 77
9 officers, soldiers, women, and children who served at
10 Fort Ontario in war and peace is situated on the
11 grounds of the fort.

12 (7) In 1970, Fort Ontario was placed on the13 National Register of Historic Places.

14 SEC. 3. FORT ONTARIO SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.

(a) STUDY.—The Secretary of the Interior (referred
to in this section as the "Secretary") shall conduct a special resource study of Fort Ontario in Oswego, New York.
(b) CONTENTS.—In conducting the study under subsection (a), the Secretary shall—

20 (1) evaluate the national significance of the21 site;

(2) determine the suitability and feasibility of
designating the site as a unit of the National Park
System;

(3) consider other alternatives for preservation,
 protection, and interpretation of the lands by Fed eral, State, or local governmental entities, or private
 and nonprofit organizations;

5 (4) consult with interested Federal, State, or
6 local governmental entities, private and nonprofit or7 ganizations or any other interested individuals;

8 (5) determine the effect of the designation of 9 the site as a unit of the National Park System on 10 existing commercial and recreational uses and the 11 effect on State and local governments to manage 12 those activities;

(6) identify any authorities, including condemnation, that may compel or allow the Secretary
to influence or participate in local land use decisions
(such as zoning) or place restrictions on non-Federal
land if the site is designated a unit of the National
Park System; and

(7) identify cost estimates for any Federal acquisition, development, interpretation, operation, and
maintenance associated with the alternatives.

(c) APPLICABLE LAW.—The study authorized under
subsection (a) shall be conducted in accordance with section 100507 of title 54, United States Code.

(d) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date
 on which funds are first made available for the study
 under subsection (a), the Secretary shall submit to the
 Committee on Natural Resources of the House of Rep resentatives and the Committee on Energy and Natural
 Resources of the Senate a report that describes—

- 7 (1) the findings of the study; and
- 8 (2) any conclusions and recommendations of the9 Secretary.
