  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "National Nurse Act5 of 2017".

### 1 SEC. 2. NATIONAL NURSE FOR PUBLIC HEALTH.

2 Title XVII of the Public Health Service Act (42
3 U.S.C. 300u et seq.) is amended by adding at the end
4 the following:

### 5 "SEC. 1711. NATIONAL NURSE FOR PUBLIC HEALTH.

6 "(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—The same individual des7 ignated as the Chief Nurse Officer of the Public Health
8 Service under section 205 shall also be designated by the
9 Secretary as the National Nurse for Public Health.

10 "(b) DUTIES.—The National Nurse for Public11 Health shall carry out the following:

12 "(1) Provide leadership and coordination of Public Health Service nursing professional affairs 13 14 for the Office of the Surgeon General and other 15 agencies of the Public Health Service, including pro-16 viding representation for the Government of the 17 United States at the Global Forum for Government 18 Chief Nursing and Midwifery Officers and serving as 19 a member of the Federal Nursing Service Council.

"(2) Represent the Surgeon General and the
agencies of Public Health Service in communications
with groups and societies concerned with nursing
issues at the local, State, national, and international
levels.

1 Committee on matters such as standards, recruit-2 ment, retention, readiness, and career development of nurses employed by and contracted with agencies 3 4 of the Public Health Service. "(4) Conduct outreach and education for pur-5 6 poses of paragraphs (5) through (7). 7 "(5) Provide guidance and leadership for activi-8 ties to promote the public health, including encour-9 aging nurses and other health professionals to be 10 volunteers and developing projects that educate the 11 public about and engage the public in prevention 12 practices to achieve better health. 13 "(6) Provide guidance and leadership to encour-14 age nurses to engage in furthering their education in 15 order to conduct nursing research, increase the 16 awareness of evidence-based practice, and educate 17 future nurses. 18 "(7) Provide guidance and leadership for activi-19 ties that will increase public safety and emergency 20 preparedness. "(c) NATIONAL HEALTH PRIORITIES-NATIONAL 24 PREVENTION STRATEGY.— 25

1	"(1) IN GENERAL.—The National Nurse for
2	Public Health, in cooperation with the Surgeon Gen-
3	eral of the Public Health Service, heads of the agen-
4	cies of the Public Health Service, States, and orga-
5	nizations that represent health professionals, shall
6	continue to participate in the identification of na-
7	tional health priorities.
8	"(2) ADDRESSING NATIONAL HEALTH PRIOR-
9	ITIES.—The National Nurse for Public Health, in
10	addressing national health priorities, shall encourage
11	volunteerism of nurses and other individuals, and
12	strengthen the relationship between Government
13	agencies and health-related national organizations.
14	"(3) Community-based projects.—
15	"(A) IMPLEMENTATION.—In addressing
16	national health priorities, the National Nurse
17	for Public Health shall—
18	"(i) provide guidance and coordination
19	on recommended activities to organiza-
20	tions;
21	"(ii) acknowledge successful programs
22	and encourage their replication;
23	"(iii) promote the dissemination of
24	evidence-based practice in educating the

public on health promotion and disease
prevention activities;
"(iv) encourage practicing nurses and
other health professionals, including retired
health professionals and students enrolled
in health professional programs, to partici-
pate in health promotion activities and rep-
licate successful health promotion activities
in their local communities; and
"(v) collaborate with Federal agencies
to monitor activities being conducted
through the collection and evaluation of
data to determine if national health prior-
ities are being addressed.
"(B) OUTREACH AND EDUCATION.—In
conducting outreach and education under sub-
section (b)(4), the National Nurse for Public
Health shall give priority to the inclusion of di-
verse approaches, including social media cam-
paigns, to address national health priorities.
"(C) DISSEMINATION OF INFORMATION.—
The National Nurse for Public Health shall dis-
seminate information to governmental agencies,
schools, and community-based, nonprofit orga-
nizations interested in health promotion and

2 tion.".
