A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the Sunshine House Regional Children's Advocacy Center and honoring
- 2 Executive Director Carol V. Donaldson; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, the Sunshine House Regional Children's Advocacy Center (CAC) was created
- 4 in 1992 for the purpose of improving the community at large by providing prevention,
- 5 intervention, and aftercare services to all child victims of abuse, nonoffending parents and
- 6 caretakers, agencies, and professionals within the Middle Judicial Circuit of Candler,
- 7 Emanuel, Jefferson, Toombs, and Washington counties; and
- 8 WHEREAS, the Sunshine House CAC is governed by a volunteer board of directors, among
- 9 whom is Carol V. Donaldson, who has served as executive director of the center for 21 years;
- 10 and
- WHEREAS, the center provides professionals with the advanced training they require in
- 12 order to conduct forensic interviews and medical examinations at the request of law
- 13 enforcement agencies and the Division of Family and Children Services; and
- 14 WHEREAS, crisis counseling and therapy are provided by licensed professionals in a
- 15 nonthreatening and child friendly environment, allowing children to remain the focus of
- 16 investigations while simultaneously reducing trauma in those who have been physically,
- 17 sexually, or emotionally abused, as well as those who have had the misfortune of witnessing
- 18 extreme violence; and
- 19 WHEREAS, the CAC's multidisciplinary teams work efficiently so that children's cases do
- 20 not "fall through the cracks," while the children in question are able to receive resources that
- 21 will aid in reducing their trauma and that will support the investigation of their cases, all at
- 22 no cost to their families; and

23 WHEREAS, in 2017, 259 new children and over 500 individuals received services from the

- 24 Sunshine House CAC, and, to date, more than 6,220 new primary victims and their families
- 25 have been seen for services there; and
- 26 WHEREAS, among the members of the Executive Committee at Sunshine House CAC are
- 27 H. Wilder Smith Jr., Jean Schwabe, G.W. Johnson, Jr., and Carole T. Youmans; and
- 28 WHEREAS, on average, 350 children are seen each year by the Sunshine House CAC, and
- 29 more than 400 children are receiving counseling and therapy from the four licensed clinical
- 30 professionals on staff today; and
- 31 WHEREAS, of the children seen at the Sunshine House CAC, 85 percent have been sexually
- 32 abused and 30 percent of those are under the age of six; and
- WHEREAS, in light of these tragic facts, it is abundantly fitting and proper that the efforts
- 34 of this center and its staff toward protecting children who have been the victims of abuse be
- 35 appropriately recognized.
- 36 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 37 recognize the Sunshine House Regional Children's Advocacy Center and honor Executive
- 38 Director Carol V. Donaldson.
- 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 40 to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the Sunshine House
- 41 Regional Children's Advocacy Center and Executive Director Carol V. Donaldson.
