Establishing a Joint Committee on the Organization of Congress.

- 3 SECTION 1. ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMITTEE.
- 4 (a) Establishment and Membership.—There is
- 5 established an ad hoc Joint Committee on the Organiza-

- 6 (4)(A) No recommendation shall be made by the

- 9 (B) Notwithstanding subparagraph (A), any rec-
- 10 ommendation with respect to the rules and procedures of
- 11 one House which only affects matters related solely to that
- 12 House may only be made and voted on by the members
- 13 of the committee from that House, and upon its adoption
- 14 by a majority of such members shall be considered to have
- 15 been adopted by the full Committee as a recommendation
- 16 of the Committee. Once such recommendation is adopted,
- 17 the full Committee may vote to make an interim or final

19 SEC. 2. STUDY OF ORGANIZATION AND OPERATION OF THE

- 20 **CONGRESS.**
- 21 (a) In General.—The Committee shall make a full
- 22 and complete study of the organization, operations, func-
- 23 tions, and relevant interactions of the Members of Con-
- 24 gress and make recommendations that serve the following
- 25 objectives:

- (1) Making the operations and the organization
 of the Congress more effective and more efficient.
 (2) Making the Congress and its members more
 - (2) Making the Congress and its members more accountable to the citizens they serve.
 - (3) Improving the relationships between the Houses of Congress.
 - (4) Improving the relationships between and among other branches of the Government, particularly relative to the congressional oversight of those branches.
 - (5) Improving the orderly, timely, and effective consideration and disposal of legislation.
 - (6) Improving the relationships among both elected Members of the Congress and the staff of those Members, particularly relating to relationships between the minority and majority Members.
 - (7) Improving the relationship between members and the citizens they serve, especially in the opportunities citizens have to participate in the process of governing.
- 21 (b) Additional Matter To Be Studied.—The
- 22 Committee shall also include in its study the role of the
- 23 standing, select, and special committees and their effec-
- 24 tiveness in addressing legislative responsibilities, particu-
- 25 larly those involving the authorization of Federal pro-

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grams and agencies and the future fiscal impact of entitlement programs. SEC. 3. AUTHORITY AND EMPLOYMENT AND COMPENSA-4 TION OF STAFF. 5 (a) AUTHORITY OF COMMITTEE.—The Committee or any of its subcommittees may— 6 7 (1) sit and act at such places and times as the Committee, or any duly authorized subcommittee 8 9 thereof, determines are appropriate during the ses-10 sions, recesses, and adjourned periods of Congress; 11 and 12 (2) require the attendance of witnesses and the 13 production of books, papers, and documents, admin-14 ister oaths, take testimony, and procure printing and 15 binding. 16 (b) APPOINTMENT AND COMPENSATION OF STAFF.— 17 (1) The Committee may appoint and fix the compensation 18 of such experts, consultants, technicians, and clerical per-19 sonnel as it deems necessary, but shall utilize existing staff to the extent possible. Staff shall be compensated and re-21 imbursed in accordance with current rules, statutes, practices, and procedures under which congressional staff are currently compensated and reimbursed for their official 24 expenses.

- 1 (2) The Committee may utilize such voluntary and
- 2 uncompensated services as it deems necessary and may
- 3 utilize the services, information, facilities, and personnel
- 4 of other agencies of the legislative branch.
- 5 (c) WITNESSES.—Witnesses requested to appear be-
- 6 fore the Committee shall be reimbursed for travel, subsist-
- 7 ence, and other necessary expenses incurred in traveling
- 8 to and from Committee proceedings.
- 9 (d) Expenses.—
- 10 (1) SENATE.—(A) The Senate members of the
- 11 Committee shall submit a budget of expenses allo-
- cable to the Senate to the Committee on Rules and
- Administration of the Senate. The Committee may
- expend for expenses allocable to the Senate not to
- exceed \$____ from the contingent fund of the
- Senate subject to approval by the Committee on
- 17 Rules and Administration until a Committee funding
- 18 resolution is approved by the Senate or, if no fund-
- ing resolution is approved, until the conclusion of
- the 115th Congress.
- 21 (B) The expenses of the Committee allocable to
- the Senate shall be paid from the contingent fund of
- the Senate, upon vouchers signed by the Senate
- chairman.

(2) House of Representatives.—There shall be paid out of the applicable accounts of the House of Representatives such sums as may be necessary for one-half of the expenses of the Committee. Such payments shall be made on vouchers signed by the chairman or vice chairman of the Committee who is a Member of the House of Representatives, as the case may be, and approved in the manner directed by the Committee on House Administration of the House of Representatives. Amounts made available under this paragraph shall be expended in accordance with regulations prescribed by the Committee on House Administration of the House of Representatives.

15 SEC. 4. COMMITTEE REPORT.

The Committee shall report its findings to the House of Representatives and the Senate not later than the conclusion of each session of Congress during which the Committee is authorized. The report at the conclusion of each session shall include recommendations of the Committee for its continuation or designation of a similar entity to continue the pursuit of improvements in the congressional process.

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
