A BILL

To require the Federal Communications Commission to reform the contribution system of the Universal Service Fund, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Reforming Broadband
- 5 Connectivity Act of 2021".
- 6 SEC. 2. STUDY AND REPORT.
- 7 Not later than 120 days after the date of enactment
- 8 of this Act, the Federal Communications Commission (re-
- 9 ferred to in this Act as the "Commission") shall—

1	(1) conduct a study assessing the need to ex-
2	pand the contribution base of the Universal Service
3	Fund to ensure that the contribution requirement
4	under section 254(d) of the Communications Act of
5	1934 (47 U.S.C. 254(d)) is imposed fairly and equi-
6	tably; and
7	(2) submit to Congress a report on the results
8	of the study conducted under paragraph (1).
9	SEC. 3. UNIVERSAL SERVICE FUND CONTRIBUTION SYSTEM
10	REFORM.
11	(a) In General.—Not later than 1 year after the
12	date of enactment of this Act, the Commission shall com-
13	plete a rulemaking to reform the contribution system of
14	the Universal Service Fund, including by expanding the
15	contribution base of the Universal Service Fund.
16	(b) Considerations.—In conducting the rule-
17	making required under subsection (a), the Commission
18	shall consider—
19	(1) the relative equities and burdens of the pro-
20	posed changes to the contribution system of the Uni-
21	versal Service Fund with respect to consumers and
22	businesses;
23	(2) the impact of the proposed changes to the
24	contribution system of the Universal Service Fund
25	on seniors; and

- 1 (3) the findings and recommendations in the re-
- 2 port submitted under section 2(2).

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
