## A BILL

To discontinue a Federal program that authorizes State and local law enforcement officers to investigate, apprehend, and detain aliens in accordance with a written agreement with the Director of U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement and to clarify that immigration enforcement is solely a function of the Federal Government.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Protecting the Rights  
5 Of Towns against federal Enforcement contrary to Con-

1 stitutional Tenets for Immigration Act” or the “PRO-  
2 TECT Immigration Act”.

3 **SEC. 2. RESCISSION OF STATE AND LOCAL IMMIGRATION**  
4 **ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITY.**

5 Section 287(g) of the Immigration and Nationality  
6 Act (8 U.S.C. 1357(g)) is amended to read as follows:

7 “(g) Except as provided in sections 103(a)(10) and  
8 274(e) of this Act and in section 439 of the Antiterrorism  
9 and Effective Death Penalty Act of 1996 (8 U.S.C.  
10 1252c), the authority to inquire about or verify immigra-  
11 tion or citizenship status and to investigate, apprehend,  
12 arrest, or detain an individual for a violation of this Act  
13 or any regulation authorized by this Act—

14 “(1) is restricted to immigration officers and  
15 authorized employees of the Department of Home-  
16 land Security; and

17 “(2) is subject to limits set forth in other provi-  
18 sions of law.”.
