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- 1 (a) The State Highway Administration, in collaboration with the Maryland 2 Transportation Institute, shall conduct a study on traffic technology and traffic 3 management techniques used around the world to maximize traffic movement.
- 4 (b) The purpose of the study is to identify traffic technology and traffic 5 management techniques that may be used to maximize the efficiency of traffic movement 6 on U.S. Route 50 between the Severn River Bridge and the Kent Narrows Bridge and on the Chesapeake Bay Bridge.
 - (c) In conducting the study, the State Highway Administration shall:
- 9 (1) analyze the existing traffic conditions on U.S. Route 50 between the 10 Severn River Bridge and the Kent Narrows Bridge and on the Chesapeake Bay Bridge;
- 11 (2) identify traffic technology and traffic management techniques used in 12 cities, states, and countries to manage congestion and traffic effectively, including 13 platooning, metering technology, and lane narrowing;
- 14 (3) explore the options for implementing traffic technology and traffic 15 management techniques on U.S. Route 50 between the Severn River Bridge and the Kent 16 Narrows Bridge and on the Chesapeake Bay Bridge; and
- 17 (4) develop recommendations on the feasibility of implementing, financing,
 18 and operating traffic technology and traffic management techniques on U.S. Route 50
 19 between the Severn River Bridge and the Kent Narrows Bridge and on the Chesapeake Bay
 20 Bridge.
- 21 (d) (1) The State Highway Administration shall update the Chesapeake Bay 22 Bridge Reconstruction Advisory Group on the progress of the study quarterly.
