## A BILL

To reauthorize the grant program for school security in the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Student, Teachers, and
- 5 Officers Preventing School Violence Act of 2018" or the
- 6 "STOP School Violence Act of 2018".
- 7 SEC. 2. GRANT PROGRAM FOR SCHOOL SECURITY.
- 8 Part AA of title I of the Omnibus Crime Control and
- 9 Safe Streets Act of 1968 (34 U.S.C. 10551 et seq.) is
- 10 amended—

1	(1) in section 2701 (34 U.S.C. 10551)—
2	(A) in subsection (a)—
3	(i) by striking "Director of the Office
4	of Community Oriented Policing Services"
5	and inserting "Director of the Bureau of
6	Justice Assistance'; and
7	(ii) by striking "including the place-
8	ment and use of metal detectors and other
9	deterrent measures" and inserting
10	"through evidence-based training and tech-
11	nical assistance to prevent violence";
12	(B) in subsection (b)—
13	(i) by striking paragraphs (1), (2),
14	and (3) and inserting the following:
15	"(1) Training to prevent student violence
16	against others and self, including training for local
17	law enforcement officers, school personnel, and stu-
18	dents.
19	"(2) The development and operation of anony-
20	mous reporting systems for threats of school vio-
21	lence, including mobile telephone applications, hot-
22	lines, and internet websites.";
23	(ii) by redesignating paragraphs (4),
24	(5), and (6) as paragraphs (3), (4), and
25	(5), respectively;

1	(iii) in paragraph (3), as so redesig-
2	nated—
3	(I) by striking "crisis" and in-
4	serting "school threat assessment
5	and"; and
6	(II) by inserting "and school per-
7	sonnel," after "law enforcement agen-
8	cies"; and
9	(iv) by inserting after paragraph (5),
10	as so redesignated, the following:
11	"(6) Subgrants to State or local law enforce-
12	ment agencies, schools, school districts, nonprofit or-
13	ganizations, or Indian tribal organizations to imple-
14	ment grants awarded under this section.";
15	(C) in subsection (c)—
16	(i) by striking "and has" and insert-
17	ing "has"; and
18	(ii) by inserting before the period at
19	the end the following: ", and will use evi-
20	dence-based strategies and programs, such
21	as those identified by the Comprehensive
22	School Safety Initiative of the Department
23	of Justice"; and
24	(D) in subsection (d)(1), by striking "50
25	percent" and inserting "75 percent";

1	(2) in section 2702 (34 U.S.C. 10552)—
2	(A) in subsection (a)(2), in the matter pre-
3	ceding subparagraph (A), by striking "child
4	psychologists" and inserting "mental health
5	professionals"; and
6	(B) in subsection (b), by striking "this
7	part" and inserting "the STOP School Violence
8	Act of 2018";
9	(3) in section 2704(1) (34 U.S.C. 10554(1)), by
10	striking "a public" and inserting "an"; and
11	(4) in section 2705—
12	(A) by striking "\$30,000,000" and insert-
13	ing "\$50,000,000"; and
14	(B) by striking "2001 through 2009" and
15	inserting "2019 through 2028".
