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## **Alcohol and Tobacco Commission - Clarifications**

FOR the purpose of clarifying the authority, powers, and duties of officers and employees of the Field Enforcement Division in the Office of the Executive Director of the Alcohol and Tobacco Commission over certain matters; substituting references to the Division and the Commission, respectively, for references to the Comptroller in certain provisions relating to alcohol and tobacco; authorizing the officers and employees to make certain cooperative arrangements with the Office of the Comptroller; authorizing the Division to recommend certain changes to improve the administration of certain provisions; authorizing the Executive Director to delegate certain duties to certain persons; requiring the Executive Director to maintain certain records; requiring the Commission and the Comptroller to cooperate in the sharing of certain information and personnel in certain inspections and other activities for certain purposes; requiring the Commission and the Comptroller to enter into a certain memorandum of understanding for certain purposes; authorizing the Commission to enter into memoranda of understanding and certain arrangements with other governmental units for certain purposes; providing that certain seizures must be reported to the Division; requiring the Commission to provide certain notice of certain seized contraband; providing that the Commission may take certain actions; requiring certain property seizures and destruction to be reported to the Executive Director; providing for the inspection and search of certain property by certain officers; providing for the seizure, forfeiture, and disposition of certain property; providing for the issuance of certain summonses by the Commission; prohibiting the violation of certain regulations the Commission adopts; providing that authorized members of the Division are police officers and law




