A BILL

To improve Federal data collection by requiring the collection of information on sexual orientation and gender identity in the decennial census and the American Community Survey.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Census Equality Act".

SEC. 2. REQUIREMENT TO COLLECT DATA ON SEXUAL ORI-2 ENTATION AND GENDER IDENTITY. 3 (a) Definitions.—In this section: (1) Bureau.—The term "Bureau" means the 4 5 Bureau of the Census. 6 (2) Gender identity.—The term "gender 7 identity" means the gender-related identity, appear-8 ance, or mannerisms or other gender-related charac-9 teristics of an individual, regardless of the des-10 ignated sex of the individual at birth. 11 (3) HOUSEHOLD DATA.—The term "household 12 data" means information about individuals who oc-13 cupy a housing unit. (4) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means 14 15 the Secretary of Commerce. 16 (5) SEXUAL ORIENTATION.—The term "sexual 17 orientation" means homosexuality, heterosexuality, 18 or bisexuality. 19 (b) Expansion of Data Collection.— 20 (1) In General.—The Secretary, in carrying 21 out sections 141 and 193 of title 13, United States 22 Code, shall expand the data collection efforts of the Bureau to require the collection of data concerning 23 24 sexual orientation and gender identity as part of the 25 decennial census and the American Community Sur-

vey.

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- 1 (2) Methods.—Not later than 1 year after the 2 date of enactment of this Act, the Bureau shall re-3 search, identify, and begin implementing a plan to 4 include questions concerning sexual orientation and 5 gender identity in the decennial Census and the 6 American Community Survey.
- 7 (c) Implementation.—The plan required under 8 subsection (b) shall require—
 - (1) inclusion of questions concerning sexual orientation and gender identity on the decennial census at the earliest feasible date, but not later than the 2030 decennial census; and
 - (2) inclusion of questions concerning sexual orientation and gender identity on the American Community Survey no later than 2020.

(d) Census Data Reports.—

- (1) DECENNIAL CENSUS.—Any report published by the Bureau that relies on gender data or household data from a decennial census conducted after the date on which the decennial census includes questions concerning sexual orientation and gender identity shall include information on sexual orientation and gender identity.
- 24 (2) AMERICAN COMMUNITY SURVEY.—Any re-25 port published by the Bureau that relies on gender

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- data or household data from an American Community Survey conducted after the date on which the American Community Survey includes questions concerning sexual orientation and gender identity shall include information on sexual orientation and gender identity.
- 7 (e) CONFIDENTIALITY.—All information collected re8 lating to sexual orientation or gender identity of a partici9 pant in the decennial census or the American Community
 10 Survey shall be maintained by the Bureau in accordance
 11 with the confidentiality and privacy standards and policies
 12 mandated by sections 9 and 214 of title 13, United States
 13 Code.

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
