#### A BILL

To direct the Assistant Secretary for Communications and Information to take certain actions to enhance the representation of the United States and promote United States leadership in communications standards-setting bodies, and for other purposes.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Promoting United States
5	Wireless Leadership Act of 2019".
6	SEC. 2. REPRESENTATION AND LEADERSHIP OF UNITED
7	STATES IN COMMUNICATIONS STANDARDS-
8	SETTING BODIES.
9	(a) In General.—In order to enhance the representa-
10	tion of the United States and promote United States leader-
11	ship in standards-setting bodies that set standards for 5G
12	networks and for future generations of wireless communica-
13	tions networks, the Assistant Secretary shall, in consulta-
14	tion with the National Institute of Standards and Tech-
15	nology, coordinate executive branch efforts to—
16	(1) equitably encourage participation by compa-
17	nies and a wide variety of relevant stakeholders, but
18	not including any company or relevant stakeholder
19	that the Assistant Secretary has determined to be not
20	trusted, (to the extent such standards-setting bodies
21	allow such stakeholders to participate) in such stand-
22	ards-setting bodies; and
23	(2) equitably offer technical expertise to compa-
24	nies and a wide variety of relevant stakeholders, but
25	not including any company or relevant stakeholder

1	that the Assistant Secretary has determined to be not

5	$(b) \ Standards-Setting \ Bodies. — The \ standards-set-$					
6	6 ting bodies referred to in subsection (a) include, but					
7	not limited to—					
8	(1) the International Organization for Standard					
9	ization;					
10	(2) the voluntary standards-setting bodies that					
11	develop protocols for wireless devices and other equip-					
12	ment, such as the 3GPP and the Institute of Elec-					
13	trical and Electronics Engineers; and					
14	(3) any standards-setting body accredited by the					
15	American National Standards Institute or Alliance					
16	for Telecommunications Industry Solutions.					
17	(c) Briefing.—Not later than 60 days after the date					
18	of the enactment of this Act, the Assistant Secretary shall					
19	brief the Committee on Energy and Commerce of the House					
20	of Representatives and the Committee on Commerce,					
21	Science, and Transportation of the Senate on a strategy					
22	to carry out subsection (a).					
23	(d) Definitions.—In this section:					
24	(1) 3GPP.—The term "3GPP" means the 3rd					
25	Generation Partnership Project.					

1	(2) 5G Network.—The term "5G network"						
2	means a fifth-generation mobile network as described						
3	by 3GPP Release 15 or higher.						
4	(3) Assistant secretary.—The term "Assist-						
5	ant Secretary" means the Assistant Secretary of Com-						
6	merce for Communications and Information.						
7	(4) Cloud computing.—The term "cloud com-						
8	puting" has the meaning given the term in Special						
9	Publication 800–145 of the National Institute of						
10	Standards and Technology, entitled "The NIST Defi						
11	nition of Cloud Computing", published in September						
12	2011, or any successor publication.						
13	(5) Communications network.—The term						
14	"communications network" means any of the fol-						
15	lowing:						
16	(A) A system enabling the transmission, be-						
17	tween or among points specified by the user, of						
18	information of the user's choosing.						
19	(B) Cloud computing resources.						
20	(C) A network or system used to access						
21	cloud computing resources.						
22	(6) Not trusted.—The term "not trusted"						
23	means, with respect to a company or stakeholder, that						
24	the company or stakeholder is determined by the As-						
25	sistant Secretary to pose a threat to the national se-						

- 1 curity of the United States. In making such a deter-2 mination, the Assistant Secretary shall rely solely on 3 one or more of the following determinations:
  - (A) A specific determination made by any executive branch interagency body with appropriate national security expertise, including the Federal Acquisition Security Council established under section 1322(a) of title 41, United States Code.
  - (B) A specific determination made by the Department of Commerce pursuant to Executive Order 13873 (84 Fed. Reg. 22689; relating to securing the information and communications technology and services supply chain).
  - (C) Whether a company or stakeholder produces or provides covered telecommunications equipment or services, as defined in section 889(f)(3) of the John S. McCain National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2019 (Public Law 115–232; 132 Stat. 1918).

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
