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The House Committee on Education offers the following substitute to HB 139:

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1	To amend Article 2 of Chapter 14 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
2	relating to education accountability assessment programs, so as to provide transparency of
3	financial information of local school systems and schools to the greatest extent practicable;

- 16 The intent of this part is to provide transparency and accuracy of financial information at
- 17 <u>the local school system and school levels to the greatest extent practicable. It is the intent</u>
- of the General Assembly that local school systems and schools provide the public with

- 21 (a) The Department of Education shall make available on its website the following school
- 22 <u>site budget and expenditure information for each school unless specifically made</u>
- 23 confidential by law:

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- 24 (1) The cost of all materials, equipment, and other nonstaff support;

- 26 (3) The cost of all professional development, including training, materials, and tuition
- 27 <u>provided for instructional staff on an annual basis;</u>
- 28 (4) The total cost of facility maintenance and small capital projects;

- 30 <u>system facility plan; and</u>
- 31 (6) The per student expenditures for each local school system and school as delineated

- amended by the federal Every Student Succeeds Act.
- 34 (b) The Department of Education shall make available on its website the following school

- 59 (d) Each public school which maintains a website shall post in a prominent location on its

- 80 rating calculated by the office pursuant to Code Section 20-14-33 and as delineated in
- 81 Section 1111(h)(1)(C)(x) of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act, as
- amended by the federal Every Student Succeeds Act.
- 83 (c) The office shall report the relative financial performance of local school systems and
- 84 schools.
- 85 (d) The Department of Education shall publish annually on its website all underlying fiscal
- 86 <u>data that inform the financial efficiency rating calculated by the office pursuant to Code</u>
- 87 <u>Section 20-14-33 and an explanation of the fiscal data that inform the financial efficiency</u>
- 88 rating on a disaggregated basis.
- 89 (e) All state and local government entities, including the Department of Education,
- 90 Department of Audits and Accounts, Office of Planning and Budget, the office, and local
- 91 <u>school systems shall cooperate with and assist each other in complying with this part."</u>
