The Senate Committee on Health and Human Services offered the following substitute to SB 47:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Chapter 34 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
physicians, physician assistants, and others, so as to provide for licensure exemption for
visiting sports teams' physicians, physician assistants, and athletic trainers; to provide for
requirements; to provide for limitations; to provide for agreements with other states; to
provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

8	Chapter 34 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to physicians,
9	physician assistants, and others, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
10	" <u>43-34-29.3.</u>
11	(a) As used in this Code section, the term 'provider' means a physician, physician assistant,
12	or athletic trainer as defined by Code Section 43-5-1.
13	(b) A provider who is licensed in good standing to practice in another state shall be exempt
14	from the licensure requirements of this chapter while practicing in this state if either of the
15	following apply:
16	(1) The provider has a written or oral agreement with a sports team to provide care to the
17	team members and coaching staff traveling with the team for a specific sporting event to
18	take place in this state; or
19	(2) The provider has been invited by a national sport governing body to provide care to
20	team members and coaching staff at a national sport training center in this state or during
21	an event or competition in this state which is sanctioned by such national sport governing
22	body so long as:
23	(A) The provider's practice is limited to that required by the national sport governing
24	body; and
25	(B) The services provided by the provider are within the area of the provider's
26	competence.

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27	(c) A provider who is exempt from licensure under subsection (b) of this Code section
28	shall not:
29	(1) Provide care or consultation to any person residing in this state other than a person
30	delineated in subsection (b) of this Code section or as otherwise provided by state law;
31	<u>or</u>
32	(2) Practice at a health care clinic or health care facility, including an acute care facility.
33	(d) An exemption under subsection (b) of this Code section shall be valid as follows:
34	(1) An exemption under paragraph (1) of subsection (b) of this Code section shall remain
35	in force while the provider is traveling with the sports team but shall be no longer than
36	ten days in duration per sporting event. A maximum of 20 additional days per sporting
37	event may be granted upon prior request to the board by the provider but shall not exceed
38	30 days total; and
39	(2) An exemption under paragraph (2) of subsection (b) of this Code section shall remain
40	in force during the time certified by the national sport governing body but shall not
41	exceed 30 days.
42	(e) The board may enter into agreements with the medical licensing boards of other states
43	to implement the provisions of this Code section. Agreements shall include procedures for
44	reporting potential medical license violations."
45	SECTION 2.

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.

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
