A BILL

- To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to remove certain weapons from the definition of firearms for the purposes of the National Firearms Act, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "No Backdoor Gun3 Control Act of 2022".

4 SEC. 2. REMOVING CERTAIN WEAPONS FROM THE DEFINI5 TION OF FIREARMS.

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 5845(a) of the Internal
7 Revenue Code of 1986 is amended—

8 (1) by striking "(5) any other weapon, as de-9 fined in subsection (e);", and

(2) by redesignating paragraphs (6) through
(8) as paragraphs (5) through (7), respectively.

(b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
this section shall apply to calendar quarters beginning
more than 90 days after the date of the enactment of this
Act.

16SEC. 3. TREATMENT OF WEAPONS DETERMINED BY REF-17ERENCE TO NATIONAL FIREARMS ACT.

18 Section 5841 of the Internal Revenue Code of 198619 is amended by adding at the end the following:

"(f) ANY OTHER WEAPON REQUIREMENTS DETERMINED BY REFERENCE.—In the case of registration or licensing requirement for any other weapon under State or
local law which is determined by reference to the National
Firearms Act, any person who acquires or possesses such
a weapon in accordance with chapter 44 of title 18, United
States Code, shall be treated as meeting any such registra-

1 tion or licensing requirement with respect to such weap-2 on.".

3 SEC. 4. DESTRUCTION OF RECORDS.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after the 5 date of the enactment of this Act, the Attorney General 6 shall destroy any registration of an applicable weapon 7 maintained in the National Firearms Registration and 8 Transfer Record pursuant to section 5841 of the Internal 9 Revenue Code of 1986, any application to transfer filed under section 5812 of such Code that identifies the trans-10 feree of an applicable weapon, and any application to make 11 filed under section 5822 of such Code that identifies the 12 13 maker of an applicable weapon.

(b) APPLICABLE WEAPON.—For purposes of this section, the term "applicable weapon" has the meaning given
the term "any other weapon" in section 5845 of such
Code.

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
