A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Education – Juvenile Services Education System – Establishment, Powers, and Duties

4 FOR the purpose of repealing certain provisions of law regarding educational programs for $\mathbf{5}$ juveniles in residential facilities; establishing a Juvenile Services Education System; 6 establishing the Board of Education for the Juvenile Services Education System; 7 providing for the composition, terms, and chair and vice chair of the Board; providing 8 that each Board member is entitled to a certain stipend and reimbursement of 9 certain expenses; requiring the Board to have certain authority and responsibility 10 relating to the juvenile services educational programs in the State beginning on a 11 certain date; requiring the Board to provide certain educational services to certain 12juveniles; specifying the duties of the Board; requiring the Board to adopt certain 13 regulations in accordance with certain provisions of law; requiring the Board to 14appoint a System Superintendent for the Juvenile Services Education System; 15specifying the duties and salary of the System Superintendent; requiring each county 16board of education to pay to the Board a certain cost for certain juveniles; requiring 17the Board to comply with certain provisions of law regarding procurement of goods 18 and services, public school employee rights, and public school employer rights and 19duties; authorizing the Board to contract with a county board to assume operational 20control of certain facilities; requiring the Board and the Department of Juvenile 21Services to work cooperatively to implement certain requirements; prohibiting the 22disenrollment of certain juveniles from certain schools under certain circumstances; 23providing for the transfer of education records of certain juveniles under certain 24circumstances; requiring the Board to develop certain intake classrooms; requiring 25the Board and the Department, in consultation with county boards, to develop and 26implement a certain post custody re-enrollment procedure for certain juveniles; 27requiring the Board to offer certain postsecondary education programs to certain 28juveniles; authorizing the Board to contract with certain entities for certain 29purposes; requiring the Board to submit a certain report to certain entities on or 30 before a certain date each year; requiring the Board to be subject to a certain audit
