A BILL

- To authorize the National Medal of Honor Museum Foundation to establish a commemorative work in the District of Columbia or its environs, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION TO ESTABLISH COMMEMORA-

4 TIVE WORK.

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—The National Medal of Honor6 Museum Foundation may establish a commemorative work

on Federal land in the District of Columbia and its envi rons to honor members of the Armed Forces who received
 the Medal of Honor.

4 (b) COMPLIANCE WITH STANDARDS FOR COMMEMO5 RATIVE WORKS.—The establishment of the commemora6 tive work under this section shall be in accordance with
7 chapter 89 of title 40, United States Code (commonly
8 known as the "Commemorative Works Act").

9 (c) PROHIBITION ON THE USE OF FEDERAL 10 FUNDS.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—Federal funds may not be
used to pay any expense of the establishment of the
commemorative work under this section.

(2) RESPONSIBILITY OF THE NATIONAL MEDAL
OF HONOR MUSEUM FOUNDATION.—The National
Medal of Honor Museum Foundation shall be solely
responsible for acceptance of contributions for, and
payment of the expenses of, the establishment of the
commemorative work under this section.

20 (d) Deposit of Excess Funds.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—If upon payment of all expenses for the establishment of the commemorative
work under this section (including the maintenance
and preservation amount required by section
8906(b)(1) of title 40, United States Code), there

1	remains a balance of funds received for the estab-
2	lishment of the commemorative work, the National
3	Medal of Honor Museum Foundation shall transmit
4	the amount of the balance to the Secretary of the
5	Interior for deposit in the account provided for in
6	section 8906(b)(3) of title 40, United States Code.
7	(2) ON EXPIRATION OF AUTHORITY.—If upon
8	expiration of the authority for the commemorative
9	work under section 8903(e) of title 40, United
10	States Code, there remains a balance of funds re-
11	ceived for the establishment of the commemorative
12	work, the National Medal of Honor Museum Foun-
13	dation shall transmit the amount of the balance to
14	a separate account with the National Park Founda-
15	tion for memorials, to be available to the Secretary
16	of the Interior or Administrator (as appropriate) fol-
17	lowing the process provided in section 8906(b)(4) of
18	title 40, United States Code, for accounts estab-
19	lished under 8906(b)(2) or (3) of title 40, United
20	States Code.

21 SEC. 2. DESIGNATION.

(a) IN GENERAL.—The national museum to honor
Medal of Honor recipients to be located in Arlington,
Texas, shall, upon completion, be known and designated
as the "National Medal of Honor Museum".

(b) EFFECT OF DESIGNATION.—The national mu seum designated by this section shall not be a unit of the
 National Park System and the designation of the National
 Medal of Honor Museum shall not require or authorize
 Federal funds to be expended for any purpose related to
 that national museum.
