- FIVE MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, APPOINTED BY 1 **(2)** 2 THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE. - 2 (G) THE COMMITTEE SHALL REPORT ITS FINDINGS AND 3 RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF 4 THIS TITLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31 EACH YEAR.
- 5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 October 1, 2020.
