A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Day Care Centers for the Elderly and Day Care Centers for Adults –**
3 **Reimbursement**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Department of Health to reimburse certain day
5 care centers for a day of care under certain circumstances; and generally relating to
6 day care centers for the elderly and day care centers for adults.

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article – Health – General**

15 14–205.

16 (a) The Maryland Department of Health may use funds appropriated for the day
17 care for the elderly to:

18 (1) Assist in start–up costs of establishing a day care center for the elderly;
19 and

20 (2) Subsidize day care services for financially eligible elderly individuals.

21 (b) The services that are provided by the day care center for the elderly under this
22 section shall include:

(1) Therapeutic arts and crafts;

(2) Community excursions, if appropriate;

(3) Hobby cultivation;

(4) Health services;

(5) Counseling services for elderly individuals and their families;

(6) Group dynamics; and

(7) Other services that enhance social functioning and develop activities in daily living and personal independence.

(C) (1) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SHALL REIMBURSE A DAY CARE CENTER FOR THE ELDERLY FOR A DAY OF CARE FOR CARE THAT IS PROVIDED TO A PARTICIPANT CERTIFIED PRESENT AT THE CENTER FOR A MINIMUM OF 4 HOURS IN A DAY.

(2) IF THE DAY CARE CENTER FOR THE ELDERLY IS UNABLE TO PROVIDE CARE TO A PARTICIPANT FOR THE MINIMUM 4 HOURS IN A DAY DUE TO A WEATHER-RELATED CLOSURE OF THE CENTER OR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY EXPERIENCED BY THE PARTICIPANT WHILE AT THE CENTER, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REIMBURSE THE CENTER FOR A DAY OF CARE.

14-304.

(a) The Department of Human Services shall cooperate with and assist the Maryland Department of Health in carrying out the purposes of this subtitle.

(b) The Maryland Department of Health shall:

(1) Provide the guidance and means for establishing day care centers for adults in accordance with this subtitle;

(2) Recruit and encourage the establishment of day care centers for adults;

(3) Provide for licensing of day care centers for adults; and

(4) Adopt and enforce rules and regulations that set the standards necessary for the welfare and safety of medically handicapped adults who receive care in these day care centers for adults.

(c) (1) The Maryland Department of Health shall buy from any public or private agency the day care services for medically handicapped adults that are necessary

2 (2) These services shall include:

3 (i) Therapeutic arts and crafts;

5 (iii) Hobby cultivation;

6 (iv) Health services;

7 (v) Counseling services for medically handicapped adults and their
8 families;

9 (vi) Group dynamics; and

10 (vii) Other services that enhance social functioning and develop
11 activities in daily living and personal independence.

12 (3) (I) SUBJECT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE
13 MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SHALL REIMBURSE A DAY CARE CENTER FOR
14 ADULTS FOR A DAY OF CARE FOR CARE THAT IS PROVIDED TO A PARTICIPANT
15 CERTIFIED PRESENT AT THE CENTER FOR A MINIMUM OF 4 HOURS IN A DAY.

16 (II) IF THE DAY CARE CENTER FOR ADULTS IS UNABLE TO
17 PROVIDE CARE TO A PARTICIPANT FOR THE MINIMUM 4 HOURS IN A DAY DUE TO A
18 WEATHER-RELATED CLOSURE OF THE CENTER OR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY
19 EXPERIENCED BY THE PARTICIPANT WHILE AT THE CENTER, THE DEPARTMENT
20 SHALL REIMBURSE THE CENTER FOR A DAY OF CARE.

21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
22 October 1, 2020.
