1	SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON REPLACEMENT OF PHYSICIAN AN-
2	ESTHESIOLOGISTS UNDER HEALTH CARE
3	SYSTEM OF DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AF-
4	FAIRS.

5 (a) PROHIBITION.—The Secretary of Veterans Af-6 fairs may not—

7 (1) modify the policy of the Department of Vet-8 erans Affairs relating to anesthesia care in a manner 9 that would provide any medical professional other 10 than a physician anesthesiologist with full practice 11 authority for the furnishment of anesthesia care to 12 veterans under the laws administered by the Secretary (including by providing certified registered 13 14 nurse anesthetists with such full practice authority); 15 or

(2) finalize, implement, or enforce the provisions relating to anesthesia care of the proposed rule
titled "Advanced Practice Registered Nurses" and
published in the Federal Register on May 25, 2016
(81 Fed. Reg. 33155), or any substantially similar
rule.

(b) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit the authority of the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to issue any short-term emer-

- 1 gency order relating to the safety, care, or well-being of
- 2 veterans during surgical procedures.
