26	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

## 1 Article - Health - General

- 3 (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 4 (k) "Local behavioral health authority" means the designated county or 5 multicounty authority that is responsible for planning, managing, and monitoring publicly 6 funded mental health, substance—related disorder, and addictive disorder services.
- 7 10–1201.
- 8 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 9 (d) "Local behavioral health authority" has the meaning stated in § 7.5–101 of 10 this article.
- 11 **10–1202.2.**
- 12 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "FUND" MEANS THE SUBSTANCE ABUSE EARLY 13 INTERVENTION AND DETOXIFICATION SERVICES FUND.
- 14 (B) (1) THERE IS A SUBSTANCE ABUSE EARLY INTERVENTION AND 15 DETOXIFICATION SERVICES FUND.
- 16 (2) THE PURPOSE OF THE FUND IS TO:
- 17 (I) PROVIDE UP TO 90 DAYS OF TREATMENT AND
- 18 REHABILITATION BY THE LOCAL BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AUTHORITY FOR THE MISUSE
- 19 OF ALCOHOL AND DRUGS TO STUDENTS EXPELLED FROM SCHOOL IN PRINCE
- 20 GEORGE'S COUNTY; AND
- 21 (II) WITH ANY REMAINING MONEY IN THE FUND, COVER
- 22 EXPENSES INCURRED BY UNINSURED OR UNDERINSURED MINORS IN PRINCE
- 23 GEORGE'S COUNTY FOR TREATMENT AND SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE LOCAL
- 24 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AUTHORITY FOR THE MISUSE OF ALCOHOL AND DRUGS.
- 25 (3) THE PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT SHALL
- 26 ADMINISTER THE FUND.
- 27 (4) (I) THE FUND IS A SPECIAL CONTINUING, NONLAPSING FUND
- 28 THAT IS NOT SUBJECT TO § 7–302 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT
- 29 ARTICLE.

- 1 (II) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL HOLD THE FUND 2 SEPARATELY, AND THE COMPTROLLER SHALL ACCOUNT FOR THE FUND.
- 3 (III) THE COMPTROLLER SHALL SEPARATELY ACCOUNT FOR 4 EACH SOURCE FOR THE FUND.
- 5 (5) THE FUND CONSISTS OF:
- 6 (I) MONEY APPROPRIATED IN THE STATE BUDGET TO THE 7 FUND UNDER SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION;
- 8 (II) GIFTS OR GRANTS RECEIVED BY THE PRINCE GEORGE'S 9 COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT FOR THE FUND; AND
- 10 (III) ANY OTHER MONEY FROM ANY OTHER SOURCE ACCEPTED 11 FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE FUND.
- 12 **(6)** THE FUND MAY BE USED ONLY FOR THE PURPOSES DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH **(2)** OF THIS SUBSECTION.
- 14 (7) (I) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL INVEST THE MONEY OF THE 15 FUND IN THE SAME MANNER AS OTHER STATE MONEY MAY BE INVESTED.
- 16 (II) ANY INVESTMENT EARNINGS OF THE FUND SHALL BE 17 CREDITED TO THE GENERAL FUND OF THE STATE.
- 18 **(8)** EXPENDITURES FROM THE FUND MAY BE MADE ONLY IN 19 ACCORDANCE WITH THE STATE BUDGET.
- 20 (9) ANY UNSPENT STATE APPROPRIATION TO THE FUND SHALL 21 REVERT TO THE GENERAL FUND OF THE STATE AT THE END OF THE FISCAL YEAR.
- 22 (10) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1 EACH YEAR, BEGINNING IN 2027, THE
- 23 PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT SHALL SUBMIT TO THE
- 24 GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT
- 25 ARTICLE, AN ANNUAL REPORT OF THE FUND THAT INCLUDES, FOR THE
- 26 IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR:
- 27 (I) AN ACCOUNTING OF ALL FINANCIAL RECEIPTS AND
- 28 EXPENDITURES TO AND FROM THE FUND;

- 1 (II) THE TOTAL NUMBER OF STUDENTS EXPELLED FROM
- 2 SCHOOL IN PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY WHOSE TREATMENT OR REHABILITATION
- 3 WAS PAID FOR BY THE FUND, DISAGGREGATED BY DEMOGRAPHIC CATEGORIES;
- 4 (III) THE TOTAL NUMBER OF UNINSURED AND UNDERINSURED
- 5 MINORS REFERRED TO THE LOCAL BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AUTHORITY IN PRINCE
- 6 GEORGE'S COUNTY BY THE DEPARTMENT OR BY THE DEPARTMENT OF JUVENILE
- 7 SERVICES, DISAGGREGATED BY DEMOGRAPHIC CATEGORIES; AND
- 8 (IV) THE TOTAL NUMBER OF UNINSURED AND UNDERINSURED
- 9 MINORS WHO RECEIVED TREATMENT OR SERVICES THAT WERE COVERED BY THE
- 10 FUND, DISAGGREGATED BY DEMOGRAPHIC CATEGORIES.
- 11 (11) THE FUND MAY BE SUBJECT TO AN AUDIT BY THE LEGISLATIVE
- 12 AUDITOR.
- 13 (C) FOR FISCAL YEAR 2027 AND EACH FISCAL YEAR THEREAFTER, THE
- 14 GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET BILL AN APPROPRIATION OF
- 15 **\$2,000,000** TO THE FUND.
- 16 (D) THE DEPARTMENT OR THE DEPARTMENT OF JUVENILE SERVICES MAY
- 17 REFER STUDENTS WHO HAVE BEEN EXPELLED FROM SCHOOL IN PRINCE GEORGE'S
- 18 COUNTY TO THE LOCAL BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AUTHORITY FOR TREATMENT AND
- 19 REHABILITATION RELATED TO THE MISUSE OF ALCOHOL AND DRUGS.
- 20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
- 21 1, 2025.
