## A BILL

To prohibit the removal of Cuba from the list of state sponsors of terrorism until Cuba satisfies certain conditions, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Fighting Oppression
- 5 until the Reign of Castro Ends Act" or the "FORCE
- 6 Act".
- 7 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON REMOVAL.
- 8 (a) In General.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
- 9 sion of law, neither the President nor the Secretary of

- 1 State may remove Cuba from the list of state sponsors
- 2 of terrorism until the President makes the determination
- 3 described in section 205 of the Cuban Liberty and Demo-
- 4 cratic Solidarity (LIBERTAD) Act of 1996 (22 U.S.C.
- 5 6065).
- 6 (b) Definition.—In this section, the term "state
- 7 sponsor of terrorism" means a country the government of
- 8 which the Secretary of State determines has repeatedly
- 9 provided support for international terrorism pursuant
- 10 to—
- 11 (1) section 1754(c)(1)(A) of the Export Control
- 12 Reform Act of 2018 (50 U.S.C. 4318(c)(1)(A));
- 13 (2) section 620A of the Foreign Assistance Act
- of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2371);
- 15 (3) section 40 of the Arms Export Control Act
- 16 (22 U.S.C. 2780); or
- 17 (4) any other provision of law.

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
