The House Committee on Health and Human Services offers the following substitute to SB 115:

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 2 of Chapter 34 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to the "Medical Practice Act of the State of Georgia," so as to provide for
- 3 telemedicine licenses for physicians licensed in other states to engage in the practice of
- 4 medicine with patients in this state through telemedicine; to provide for requirements for
- 5 issuance of a telemedicine license; to provide for restrictions; to provide for notice of
- 6 restrictions placed on a license by another state; to provide for rules and regulations; to
- 7 provide for revocation; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 8 purposes.

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## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 11 Article 2 of Chapter 34 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
- 12 "Medical Practice Act of the State of Georgia," is amended by revising subsection (a) of
- 13 Code Section 43-34-31, relating to practice of medicine from foreign jurisdiction by
- 14 electronic means, as follows:
- 15 "(a) A person who is physically located in another state or foreign country and who,
- through the use of any means, including electronic, radiographic, or other means of
- telecommunication, through which medical information or data are transmitted, performs
- an act that is part of a patient care service located in this state, including but not limited to
- 19 the initiation of imaging procedures or the preparation of pathological material for
- 20 examination, and that would affect the diagnosis or treatment of the patient is engaged in
- 21 the practice of medicine in this state. Any person who performs such acts through such
- means shall be required to have a license to practice medicine in this state <u>or a telemedicine</u>
- 23 <u>license issued pursuant to Code Section 43-34-31.1</u> and shall be subject to regulation by
- 24 the board. Any such out-of-state or foreign practitioner shall not have ultimate authority
- over the care or primary diagnosis of a patient who is located in this state."

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26 SECTION 2.

27 Said article is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

- 28 "<u>43-34-31.1.</u>
- 29 (a) The board shall be authorized to issue telemedicine licenses to physicians who are
- 30 <u>licensed in other states but not licensed in this state to engage in the practice of medicine</u>
- 31 <u>through telemedicine, as defined in Code Section 33-24-56.4.</u>
- 32 (b) To be eligible for a telemedicine license, the physician shall:
- 33 (1) Hold a full and unrestricted license to practice medicine in another state;
- 34 (2) Not have had any disciplinary or other action taken against him or her by any other
- 35 <u>state or jurisdiction; and</u>
- 36 (3) Meet such other requirements established by the board pursuant to subsection (c) of
- 37 <u>this Code section as deemed necessary by the board to ensure patient safety.</u>
- 38 (c) The board shall adopt rules as to the eligibility for and the issuance of a telemedicine
- 39 <u>license</u>. Such rules shall include limiting licensees to the practice of telemedicine. A
- 40 person issued a telemedicine license pursuant to this Code section shall not be authorized
- 41 <u>to engage in the practice of medicine while physically present in this state with respect to</u>
- 42 <u>a patient also physically present in this state; provided, however, that this subsection shall</u>
- 43 <u>not apply to consultation provided in response to an emergency.</u>
- 44 (d) A person issued a telemedicine license pursuant to this Code section shall immediately
- 45 notify the board of any restrictions placed on his or her license or revocation of his or her
- 46 <u>license by a licensing board or entity in another state.</u>
- 47 (e) A person issued a telemedicine license pursuant to this Code section shall be required
- 48 to comply with all applicable requirements of the laws of this state relating to the
- 49 <u>maintenance of patient records and the confidentiality of patient information, regardless of</u>
- 50 where such physician may be located and regardless of where or how the records of any
- 51 patient located in this state are maintained.
- 52 (f) Except as otherwise provided in this Code section, a person issued a telemedicine
- 53 <u>license pursuant to this Code section shall be subject to and shall comply with the</u>
- 54 provisions of this article and the rules and regulations of the board.
- 55 (g) The license of any person who violates this Code section shall be subject to revocation
- by the board after notice and opportunity for hearing."

57 SECTION 3.

58 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
