A BILL

- To facilitate lawful international trade by increasing the daily commercial hours of operation at designated ports of entry along the southern border, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Trade Facilitation and

5 Security Enhancement Act".

6 SEC. 2. EXTENDING PORTS OF ENTRY HOURS OF OPER-7 ATION FOR COMMERCIAL VEHICLES.

8 (a) DEFINED TERM.—In this Act, the term "10 busi-9 est ports of entry" means the 10 land ports of entry on

the border between the United States and Mexico through
 which the highest total value of products and commodities
 passed through during 2017, as reported by the United
 States Census Bureau.

5 (b) MINIMUM HOURS OF OPERATION.—Not later than 6 months after the date of the enactment of this Act, 6 7 the Secretary of Homeland Security, in coordination with 8 the Commissioner of U.S. Customs and Border Protection, 9 shall facilitate the safe, secure, and efficient cross border 10 movement of people, motor vehicles, cargo, and lawful and legitimate trade travel by ensuring that commercial vehi-11 12 cles are permitted to enter into or exit from the United 13 States through the 10 busiest ports of entry for not fewer 14 than—

- 15 (1) 16 hours per day, Monday through Friday;16 and
- 17 (2) 8 hours per weekend.
- 18 SEC. 3. RESOURCES; COORDINATION.

(a) RESOURCES.—The Secretary of Homeland Security shall ensure that sufficient U.S. Customs and Border
Protection officers and resources are dedicated to designated ports of entry—

(1) to carry out the functions of commercial op-erations, including accepting entries of merchandise,

collecting duties, and enforcing the customs, immi gration, and trade laws of the United States; and
 (2) to perform the functions described in para graph (1) during the hours set forth in section 2(b)
 beginning not later than the date set forth in such
 section.

7 (b) COORDINATION.—The Secretary of Homeland Se8 curity shall coordinate with the appropriate officials of the
9 Government of Mexico to implement this section.

10 SEC. 4. PORTS OF ENTRY MODERNIZATION.

11 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Commissioner of U.S. Cus-12 toms and Border Protection, in consultation with the Ad-13 ministrator of General Services, shall conduct a study of commercial operations at the 10 busiest ports of entry to 14 15 identify any improvements that could be made to such ports of entry to facilitate lawful international trade, in-16 17 cluding redesigning, modernizing, and improving the effi-18 ciency of such ports of entry and expanding their hours 19 of operation.

(b) REPORT.—Not later than 180 days after the date
of the enactment of this Act, the Commissioner shall submit a report to Congress that summarizes the results of
the study conducting pursuant to subsection (a).

1 SEC. 5. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.
