 with the license application; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article – Alcoholic Beverages

The application shall also include a petition of support signed by at least 10 residents who are owners of real estate and registered voters of the precinct in which the business is to be conducted stating:

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applicant or, if the applicant is a corporation, acquainted with the individuals making theapplication;

6 (3) that they are familiar with the premises on which the proposed 7 business is to be conducted and that they believe the premises are suitable for the conduct 8 of business as a retail dealer.
