A BILL

To appropriate such funds as may be necessary to ensure that members of the Armed Forces, including reserve components thereof, and supporting civilian and contractor personnel continue to receive pay and allowances for active service performed when a Government shutdown occurs, and for other purposes.

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "Military Pay Protec-
3	tion Act of 2017".
4	SEC. 2. EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS TO PRO-
5	VIDE PAY AND ALLOWANCES FOR MEMBERS
6	OF THE ARMED FORCES AND SUPPORTING
7	CIVILIAN AND CONTRACTOR PERSONNEL
8	DURING GOVERNMENT SHUTDOWN.
9	(a) Emergency Appropriation.—During a Gov-
10	ernment shutdown, the Secretary of the Treasury shall
11	make available to the Secretary of Defense (and the Sec-
12	retary of Homeland Security in the case of the Coast
13	Guard), out of any amounts in the general fund of the
14	Treasury not otherwise appropriated, such amounts as the
15	Secretary of Defense (and the Secretary of Homeland Se-
16	curity in the case of the Coast Guard) determines to be
17	necessary to continue to provide the following:
18	(1) Pay and allowances (without interruption)
19	to the following:
20	(A) Members of the Army, Navy, Air
21	Force, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard, includ-
22	ing reserve components thereof, who perform
23	active service during the Government shutdown.
24	(B) At the discretion of the Secretary of
25	Defense, such civilian personnel of the Depart-
26	ment of Defense who are providing support to

- the members of the Armed Forces described in paragraph (1) as the Secretary considers appropriate.
 - (C) At the discretion of the Secretary of Defense, such personnel of contractors of the Department of Defense who are providing direct support to the members of the Armed Forces described in paragraph (1) as the Secretary considers appropriate.
 - (2) Funding necessary to prevent interruptions or delays in the performance of domestic disaster relief and recovery operations by military, civilian, and contractor personnel during the Government shutdown.
- 15 (b) GOVERNMENT SHUTDOWN DEFINED.—In this 16 section, the term "Government shutdown" means any por17 tion of a fiscal year for which funds have not been appro18 priated for the purposes specified in subsection (a) for the 19 entire fiscal year and an Act or joint resolution making 20 continuing appropriations for such purposes for that por21 tion of the fiscal year is not in effect.

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
