Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-1 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. 4 This Act may be cited as the "Moving Americans Pri-5 vacy Protection Act". 6 SEC. 2. PROTECTION OF PERSONALLY IDENTIFIABLE IN-7 FORMATION. 8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 431(c)(2) of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1431(c)(2)) is amended to read as fol-9 10 lows: "(2)(A) The information listed in paragraph (1) shall 11 not be available for public disclosure if— 12 13 "(i) the Secretary of the Treasury makes an af-14 firmative finding on a shipment-by-shipment basis 15 that disclosure is likely to pose a threat of personal 16 injury or property damage; or 17 "(ii) the information is exempt under the provi-18 sions of section 552(b)(1) of title 5, United States 19 Code. 20 "(B) The Secretary shall ensure that any personally 21 identifiable information, including Social Security account 22 numbers and passport numbers, is removed from any mani-23 fest signed, produced, delivered, or electronically trans-24 mitted under this section before access to the manifest is

25 provided to the public.".

(b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by sub section (a) shall take effect on the date that is 30 days after
the date of the enactment of this Act.
