# A BILL

- To establish a grant program to encourage the use of assistance dogs by certain members of the Armed Forces and veterans.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Wounded Warrior

5 Service Dog Act of 2017".

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### 1 SEC. 2. WOUNDED WARRIOR K-9 CORPS.

2 (a) GRANTS AUTHORIZED.—Subject to the avail-3 ability of appropriations provided for such purpose, the Secretary of Defense and the Secretary of Veterans Af-4 5 fairs shall jointly establish a program, to be known as the 6 "K–9 Service Corps Program", to award competitive 7 grants to nonprofit organizations to assist such organiza-8 tions in the planning, designing, establishing, or operating 9 (or any combination thereof) of programs to provide assistance dogs to covered members and veterans. 10

- 11 (b) USE OF FUNDS.—
- (1) IN GENERAL.—The recipient of a grant
  under this section shall use the grant to carry out
  programs that provide assistance dogs to covered
  members and veterans who have a disability described in paragraph (2).
- 17 (2) DISABILITY.—A disability described in this18 paragraph is any of the following:
- 19 (A) Blindness or visual impairment.
- 20 (B) Loss of use of a limb, paralysis, or
- 21 other significant mobility issues.
- 22 (C) Loss of hearing.
- 23 (D) Traumatic brain injury.
- 24 (E) Post-traumatic stress disorder.

(F) Any other disability that the Secretary
 of Defense and the Secretary of Veterans Af fairs consider appropriate.

4 (3) TIMING OF AWARD.—The Secretaries may 5 not award a grant under this section to reimburse 6 a recipient for costs previously incurred by the re-7 cipient in carrying out a program to provide assist-8 ance dogs to covered members and veterans unless 9 the recipient elects for the award to be such a reim-10 bursement.

(c) ELIGIBILITY.—To be eligible to receive a grant
under this section, a nonprofit organization shall submit
an application to the Secretary of Defense and the Secretary of Veterans Affairs at such time, in such manner,
and containing such information as the Secretary of Defense and the Secretary of Veterans Affairs may require.
Such application shall include—

18 (1) a proposal for the evaluation required by19 subsection (d); and

20 (2) a description of—

21 (A) the training that will be provided by
22 the organization to covered members and vet23 erans;

24 (B) the training of dogs that will serve as25 assistance dogs;

| 18 | national, the International Guide Dog Federa-     |
| 19 | tion, or another similar widely recognized ac-    |
| 20 | creditation organization that the Secretaries de- |
| 21 | termine has accreditation standards that meet     |
| 22 | or exceed the standards of Assistance Dogs        |
| 23 | International and the International Guide Dog     |

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| 1 | (B) is a candidate for such accreditation or  |

4 (d) EVALUATION.—The Secretary shall require each 5 recipient of a grant to use a portion of the funds made 6 available through the grant to conduct an evaluation of 7 the effectiveness of the activities carried out through the 8 grant by such recipient.

9 (e) DEFINITIONS.—In this Act:

10 (1) ASSISTANCE DOG.—The term "assistance 11 dog" means a dog specifically trained to perform 12 physical tasks to mitigate the effects of a disability 13 described in subsection (b)(2), except that the term 14 does not include a dog specifically trained for com-15 fort or personal defense.

16 (2) COVERED MEMBERS AND VETERANS.—The
17 term "covered members and veterans" means—

18 (A) with respect to a member of the
19 Armed Forces, such member who is—

20 (i) receiving medical treatment, recu21 peration, or therapy under chapter 55 of
22 title 10, United States Code;

23 (ii) in medical hold or medical hold24 over status; or

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(iii) covered under section 1202 or
 1205 of title 10, United States Code; and
 (B) with respect to a veteran, a veteran
 who is enrolled in the health care system estab lished under section 1705(a) of title 38, United
 States Code.
 (f) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is

8 authorized to be appropriated to carry out this Act9 \$5,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2018 through 2022.

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
